

PEACH SALAD

Canned cling peaches and cottage cheese dress up a light and fluffy souffle salad deliciously for spring. This is quick to make for you chill the gelatin mixture briefly in a refrigerator tray, then beat it until fluffy. Golden slices of canned cling peaches, and snowy curds of cottage cheese are most attractive in this quick-setting gelatin salad.

PEACH SOUFFLE SALAD

1 package lemon-flavored gelatin
1 cup hot water
1-3 cup cold water
1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup mayonnaise
1 cup cottage cheese
1 1/2 cups canned cling peach slices
Salad greens
Dissolve gelatin in hot water.

Stir in cold water, lemon juice and salt. Add mayonnaise and beat with rotary beater until smooth. Turn into refrigerator tray and place in freezing compartment 15 to 20 minutes, until mixture is set about an inch in from sides, but soft in center. Turn out into bowl and beat until fluffy. Fold in cottage cheese and well-drained peach slices. Turn into individual molds and chill until firm. Unmold on salad greens to serve.

DATE BREAD

Party Date Bread is richly fruited with fresh California dates, candied cherries and pineapple. It's delicious plain or spread with cream cheese or softened butter. Try it lightly toasted, too, as a special treat. Fresh dates give a moistness and flavor to this fruit bread that's hard to beat. You'll find the loaf keeps well if wrapped in foil and stored in a cool place. It freezes nicely, too, should you

want to make several loaves at one time.

PARTY DATE BREAD
1 cup fresh California dates
1-3 cup candied cherries
1/2 cup candied pineapple
1/4 cup shortening
1/2 cup sugar
1 egg
1-3 cups milk
2 1/2 cups sifted all-purpose flour
4 teaspoons baking powder
1 teaspoon salt

Pit and slice dates. Quarter cherries, and slice pineapple thinly. Cream shortening and sugar together. Add egg and beat well. Blend in milk. Sift flour with baking powder and salt. Blend into batter. Stir in fruits. Turn into greased loaf (about 8 1/2 x 4 x 2 1/2 inches). Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees) about 1 1/4 hours. Let stand 10 minutes, then turn out onto wire rack to cool. Makes one loaf.

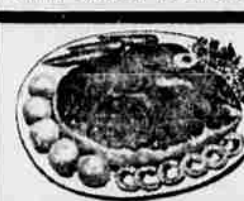
