

Naval Ship To Become Med Center

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Conversion of the mothballed Navy hospital ship Consolation into a floating medical center for a unique type of health service in Southeast Asia and elsewhere is finally about to get under way. "Project Hope" will cost around \$2 million for modification of the white-hulled, 15,000-ton vessel, and the first year of operation in Asian waters will run about 3½ million dollars more.

The Consolation, laid-up in San Francisco Bay Naval Yards since her return from 20 months of war service during the Korean conflict, will be renamed the Hope — taken from the initials of the project's concept of "Health Opportunity for People Everywhere."

"Project Hope" is sponsored by the People-to-People Health Foundation—a private program initiated at suggestion of President Eisenhower to promote world peace through increased understanding between peoples.

The Hope will be staffed with both fulltime and rotating medical personnel. She will have a permanent staff of 15 physicians, two dentists, 20 nurses and 20 auxiliary personnel. A rotating group of 35 physicians will be flown to the ship periodically for four-month tours of duty and a virtual post-graduate training course.

The Hope's first port of call will be Jakarta, Indonesia. Other countries that have invited her to call include Vietnam, Korea, Pakistan, Okinawa and Morocco.

The approximately \$2 million conversion job will be paid for by the government but funds for the Hope's operation overseas are being raised through a national campaign.

East Teacher Suspended

PITTSBURGH (AP) — Teacher Bowdan Pashkowsky is under suspension at Langley High School today, accused of paddling 30 male pupils who didn't know the answers. Principal Tarry Book said Wednesday he suspended Pashkowsky, a social science teacher, following a meeting with a delegation of mothers. Book said Pashkowsky, about 30, became irritated Tuesday when the pupils in the four eighth-

grade classes he teaches displayed a profound ignorance of the subject he was teaching them. In retaliation, said Book, Pashkowsky individually brought each male student before the class, posed a series of questions and meted out swats with a paddle on the basis of answers. The teacher threatened girl pupils with the same, the principal added.

"No one was seriously hurt by the paddlings," Book went on. "But he seriously and willfully violated the rules." Pashkowsky could not be reached for comment.

Girl Killed; Dad Suicides

NEWARK, N.J. (AP) — "Please don't go. Stay here," pleaded Angela Mongiovi's sister-in-law, But Angela, 18, wouldn't listen. She went outside where her father was waiting.

He shot her dead and then killed himself, police said. The father, Benedetto Mongiovi, a 52-year-old grocer, was angry Wednesday because his daughter had left home last Monday and moved in with her brother, Philip, 25, and his wife, Joyce.

Police gave this account: Philip warned his sister not to answer the door if their father came. Wednesday her father appeared.

"I have some of your clothes out in the car," he called through the door. "Will you please come and help me bring them into the house."

Despite her sister-in-law's pleas, Angela went outside. Her father began beating her. Angela ran up the stairs. Her father drew a gun and fired several times, hitting her in the head. Then he shot himself.

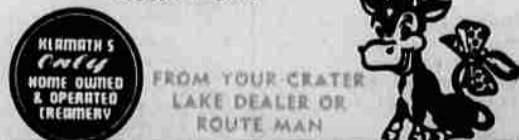
