Apologies Given Actor

NEW DELHI, India (AP)—An Indian government official today extended "unqualified apologies" for the arrest of American actor Fredric March, his wife and two friends on a prohibition charge.

Raj Bahadur of the Transport Ministry told Parliament the "whole incident was unfortunate and I wish it had not happened."

He expressed hope the U.S. Congress, in which a demand was made for an investigation of the incident, "will accept the apology."

March, his actress wife Florence Eldridge and Dr. and Mrs. Burrill Crohn of New York were arrested last month in South India's Madras State when four ounces of liquor were found in their luggage during a search at a roadblock.

A travel agency representative posted bail and March and his companions continued on a Far Eastern tour. The charges were dropped but the affair aroused criticism in India that tourists were being harassed at a time when the government sought to attract more visitors.

STRIKE IRISH AIRLINE

LONDON (UPI) — A pilots strike grounded all aircraft of Aer Lingus, the Irish airline, today. The walkout was called at midnight to protest the airline's disciplinary action against six pilots who broke company regulations which forbid them to drink within 12 hours of flying time.

Kite Fliers Get Warning

Kite flying season is near at hand, and California Oregon Power Company officials are concerned.

Kites don't want youngsters flying kites near power lines because that's not safe.

"Never," they say, "use a metal string. Use dry cotton string instead."

Here are other suggestions: pick a nice level spot away from power lines and television antennae and where there are no rocks or trees that are liable to obstruct running room. Never use streets or highways and always allow for a change in wind which might cause the kite to drift over a power line.

Don't use cord with tinsel or any cord that has strands of wire in it.

If a kite gets tangled in power lines, leave it and call Copco. The company also warns that control-line model airplanes never should be flown near power lines.

Occupational Hazards Noted

PITTSBURGH (AP) — A former warehouse clerk on trial for drunken driving says nips from broken liquor bottles made him tipsy.

John E. Gallagher, 43, of suburban Penn Hills told the judge Thursday he was arrested Aug. 17 shortly after drinking the remains of a broken shipment at a Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board warehouse.

To keep the glass out, said Gallagher, he strained the liquor through a handkerchief into the cup. He was fined \$150.

Adlai Name Withdrawn

PORTLAND (AP) — Adlai Stevenson's name apparently will not be on the Oregon presidential primary ballot May 20.

The co-chairman of the "Draft Stevenson" Committee said Thursday petitions to place Stevenson's name on the ballot will not be submitted.

Stevenson withdrew his name by affidavit when it was placed on the ballot by the secretary of state. It could not be taken off if placed on by petition.

Paul Meyer, the co-chairman, said more than the required 1,000 signatures had been obtained on the nominating petitions.

He said the committee decided not to file the name of the former Illinois governor and two-time Democratic nominee as in the best interests of the party.

Blind Girl Risks Life To Save 329

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Blind, 17-year-old Theresa Hayes was anxious that her parents know she did not fail in the performance of her duty.

That's why the slim blonde stayed at her braille-equipped switchboard Thursday, risking her life to help save 329 students at the Overbrook School for the Blind when a fire swept the main building.

"I thought it was my duty to stay at the switchboard to bring as much help as I could reach to help the nurses rescue the children," she said as she shrugged off acclaim as a heroine.

All of the students were led to safety but Fire Lt. William Adgie, 42, was killed fighting the blaze. Six other firemen were injured.

"I smelled the smoke," explained Theresa, "but it didn't bother me. I thought it was my duty to stay at the switchboard."

"I heard a big bang and the sound of breaking glass and some firemen shouted at me to get away from the switchboard. I had no feeling of danger and stayed there until someone pulled off my headset and drew me from my chair."

"Then a matron who was leading some students by the board took hold of my hand and directed me out the main entrance."

Joseph G. Gauffman, principal of the school, said the fire started in the third-floor bedroom of one of the employees who had been smoking. Rauffman said a full-scale investigation is underway.

Rescuer Drowns

FORT WORTH, Tex. (AP) — Everett Reynolds and his pal David Johnson, both 12, played Thursday on the banks of the Trinity River.

David fell into the river. Everett jumped in to save him.

David managed to swim ashore unaided. Everett drowned.

The body was recovered an hour later.

Big Damage Suit Names Boy, 6

ELIZABETH, N.J. (AP) — A suit for \$26,000 damages has been filed against a 6-year-old driver as the result of an auto accident two years ago today.

The suit, filed Wednesday, also names as defendants the boy's mother, Maria Amicucci, and the service station.

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
