Kitchen Storage For Appliances

Leaders were trained for the lesson on Kitchen Storage of Electrical Appliances in meetings held at the fairgrounds on March 8 and 9, according to Ruth G. Dyer, county extension agent.

Bernice Strawn, specialist in home management and equipment at Oregon State College, was present to teach the lesson to the homemakers. Miss Strawn is well versed in the field, having worked with REA, USDA, and authored many articles in many magazines as a result of research she had done in management and equipment.

Homemakers will hear this lesson in April through their home extension units. In this meeting they will consider the possible uses of small appliances, who uses them and where, as a background for planning suitable storage. They will evaluate the possible types of storage in relation to the individual appliances, cords, and instruction books, and the potential storage areas in their homes.

Homemakers will also learn about supplementary storage aids which can be built or purchased. Finally, they will learn how to determine which outlets in their homes are on the same circuit and the relation of these circuits to areas where appliances are used and stored.

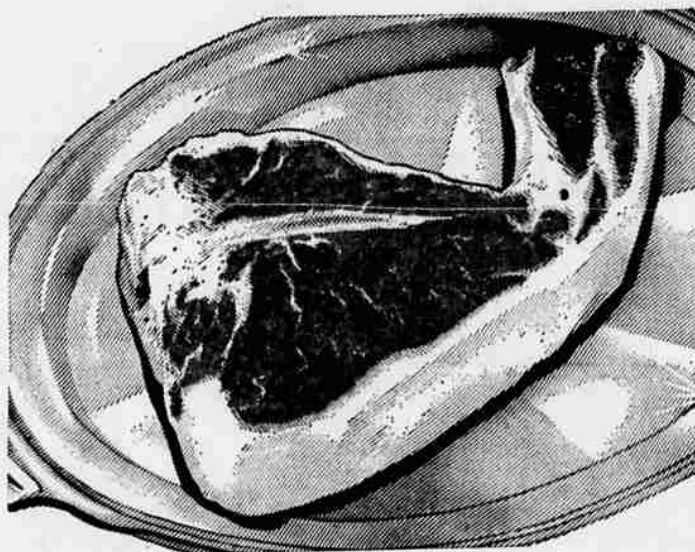
