New Delegate Plays It Cool

GENEVA (UPI) — American delegate Frederick M. Eaton is the only unfamiliar face around the negotiating table at the East-West disarmament talks here.

The other delegates are old hands at the thousands of hours of talks that over the years have preceded this 10-nation meeting. But Eaton, a Wall Street attorney, is brand new and has nothing about him to match the appearance of the usual American diplomat.

Two Perish In Accident

ANACORTES, Wash. (AP) — An automobile shot through a guard cable on a ferry Tuesday night, floated briefly while its two elderly occupants called for help, then sank in Puget Sound.

The bodies of Mr. and Mrs. Louis G. Phillips were pulled from the submerged auto some 40 minutes later.

Melvin Larsen, deckhand aboard the ferry Almar, said the car driven by Phillips, 74, was one of the last aboard the new steel ferry before it pulled away from its Anacortes landing.

The ferry crosses Guemes Channel between Anacortes and Guemes Island, where Mr. and Mrs. Phillips lived.

Larsen said he put wheel blocks behind the rear wheels of the Phillips' car, noticing at the time that its engine was still running.

"All of a sudden the car jumped backward over the wheel blocks, snapped a three-quarter inch cable across the stern and went into the water," he reported.

"The car floated for a couple of minutes before it sank. While it was still afloat the people were calling for help. Another passenger yelled 'Get out the window,' but they didn't. They went down with the car."

EXPAND JET SERVICE LONDON (UPI) — Moscow Radio announced that expanded summer airline schedules will put Soviet jets in service to 18 national capitals on April 1.

Eaton shows his impatience. He is used to moving in the upper strata of big business, where decisions are made quickly.

Eaton displayed this disregard for the forms of diplomacy on the first day of the conference Tuesday, when he waited until Soviet delegate Valerian Zorin spoke before putting on his earphones to hear the translation. During the speeches of the Bulgarian, Czech, Polish, and Romanian delegations, Eaton left the earphones on the table and did not bother to listen.
