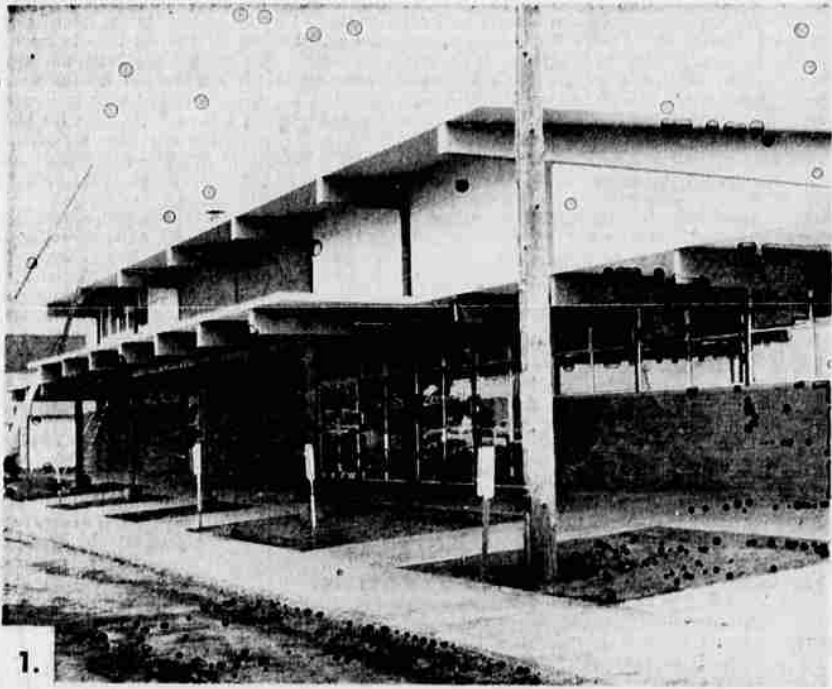


Air Terminal To Be Dedicated Sunday At 2 P. M.



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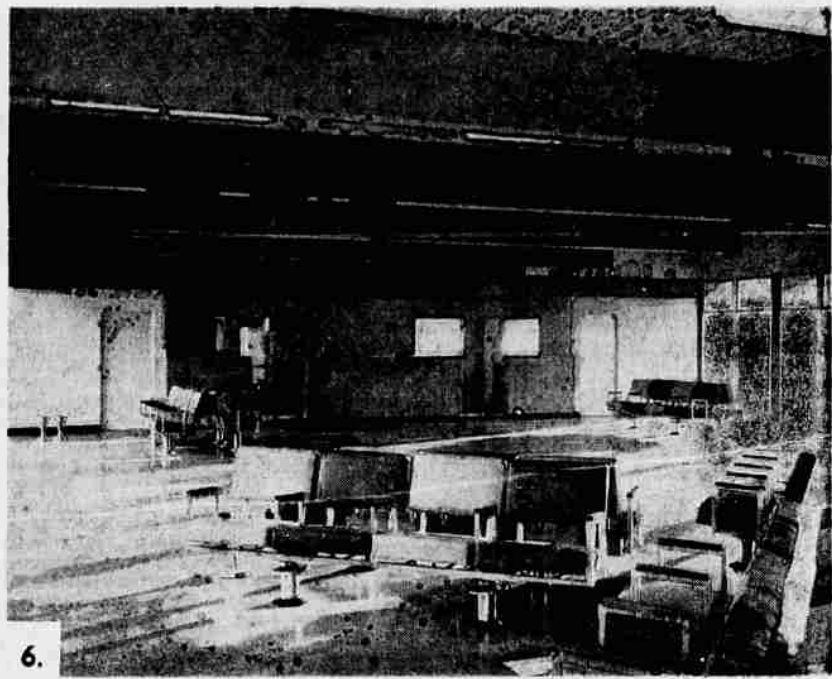
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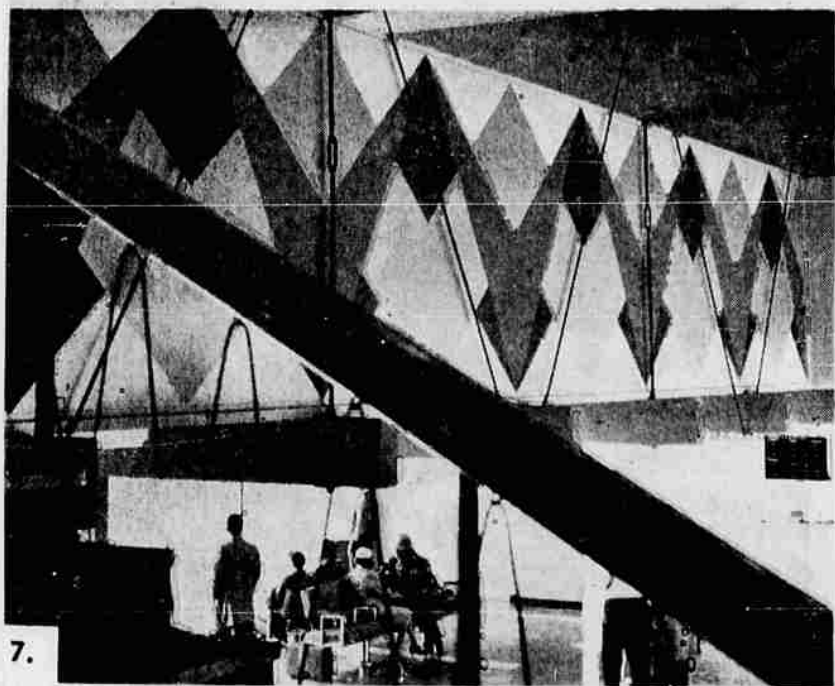
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1 — AN EXTERIOR picture of the front of the new terminal building as seen by those approaching by auto.

2 — A VIEW OF THE OLD terminal building constructed during World War II, and recently demolished to clear the view for the new building.

3 — THE VIEW of the new terminal building as seen by those approaching from the airport side such as passengers disembarking from a plane.

4 — PASSENGERS and others awaiting planes get this view of the plane's arrival as they enjoy the comforts of the special airport furniture in the building.

5 — THIS IS THE VIEW from a table in the restaurant on the second floor of the terminal building. A panoramic view of the entire field can be seen from anywhere on this floor.

6 — THE SEATING ARRANGEMENT on the main floor can be seen in this picture. The furniture is special airport furniture and was secured from a Texas firm specializing in this type of furniture.

7 — THE UNIQUE MURAL that greets the visitor as he enters the front door of the building is shown here from the steps leading to the upstairs restaurant. The mural was painted by architect John Howard and his wife and cleverly conceals the supports necessary in construction.

8 — NED PUTNAM, left, president of the Oregon Pilots Association, discusses something with Harold Jones, airport manager, in the lobby of the new building. In the background can be seen the offices for both West Coast Airlines and the two car rental agencies.

9 — A PARTIAL VIEW of the restaurant can be seen from this point in the Satellite room. The partition between restaurant and lounge has been held down to permit unobstructed vision of the entire field from any point.

10 — AIRPORT MANAGER Harold Jones studies a point in his busy round of airport activities. Jones' office is just off the lobby of the terminal building, easily accessible to the public.

11 — ONLY ONE OF TWO in existence is this fabulous Satellite Lounge at the terminal building. The night-time view fascinates visitors with its space bar which features the planets, including Earth, turning in orbit and stars constantly winking in the dark space background.



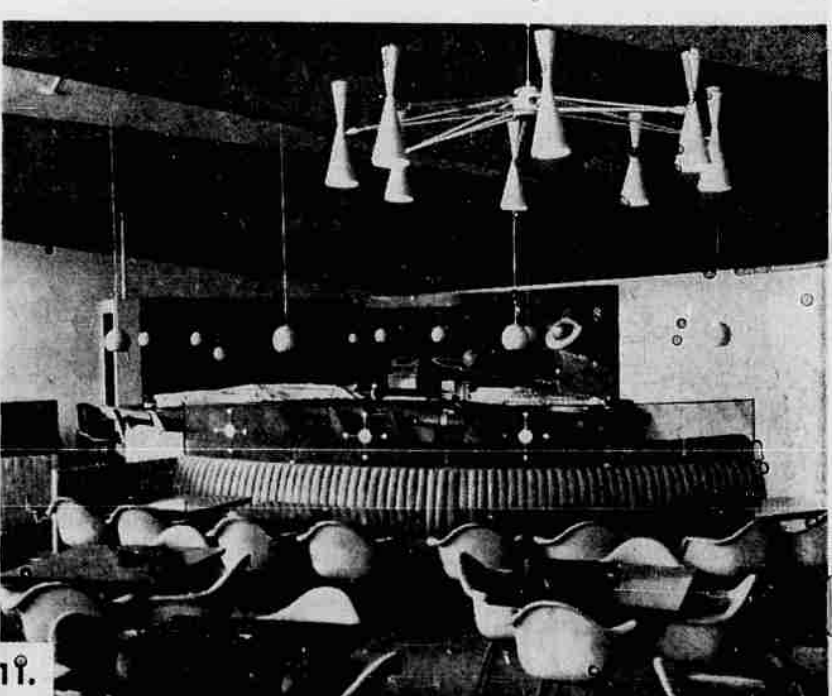
