Delegation Challenged

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP)—California's Republican delegation to the party's national convention—already pledged to the nomination of Vice President Richard M. Nixon—is being challenged as illegal by a GOP state legislator.

Charles E. Chapel of Inglewood, in Southern California, told the Assembly Thursday that the make-up of the 70-member GOP delegation violates the state election code.

Chapel asserted that some congressional districts were not represented. The election code requires two to four delegates from each county with less than two congressional districts.

The assemblyman wrote Nixon complaining the Republican legislators were snubbed in the selection of the delegation.

Pupil Papers Win Awards

NEW YORK (AP)—Student newspapers at seven schools in Oregon won awards in the annual Columbia Scholastic Press Association competition.

The Hehisch of Heppner and the White Buffalo of Madras won the medalist award for "publications of distinction" in their classification.

The awards were announced Thursday at the annual convention which opened on the Columbia University campus.

The Oregon winners: Medalist: Hehisch, Heppner High School, for duplicated newspapers in a school of 300 or less; White Buffalo, Madras Union High School, for printed newspapers in a junior-senior high of 1000 students or less.

First place: Axe, South Eugene High, for printed newspapers in a school of 1501 to 2500; Lantern, Pendleton High, for printed newspapers in a school of 501 to 750; Broadcaster, Leelan Junior High, Salem, for offset newspapers in a junior high of 701 to 1200.

Second place: Hillsides, Hillsboro High, for printed newspapers in a school of 1001 to 1500; Oranger, Roseburg High, for offset newspapers in a school of 1001 to 1500.

Final Rites Held For Coal Miners

LOGAN, W. Va. (AP)—Funeral services were held in small churches throughout the area today for some of the 18 men who died in a coal mine fire.

Some services were held Thursday and others will be held Saturday.

The last two bodies were recovered Thursday, nine days after the men were trapped deep in the mine at nearby Holden.

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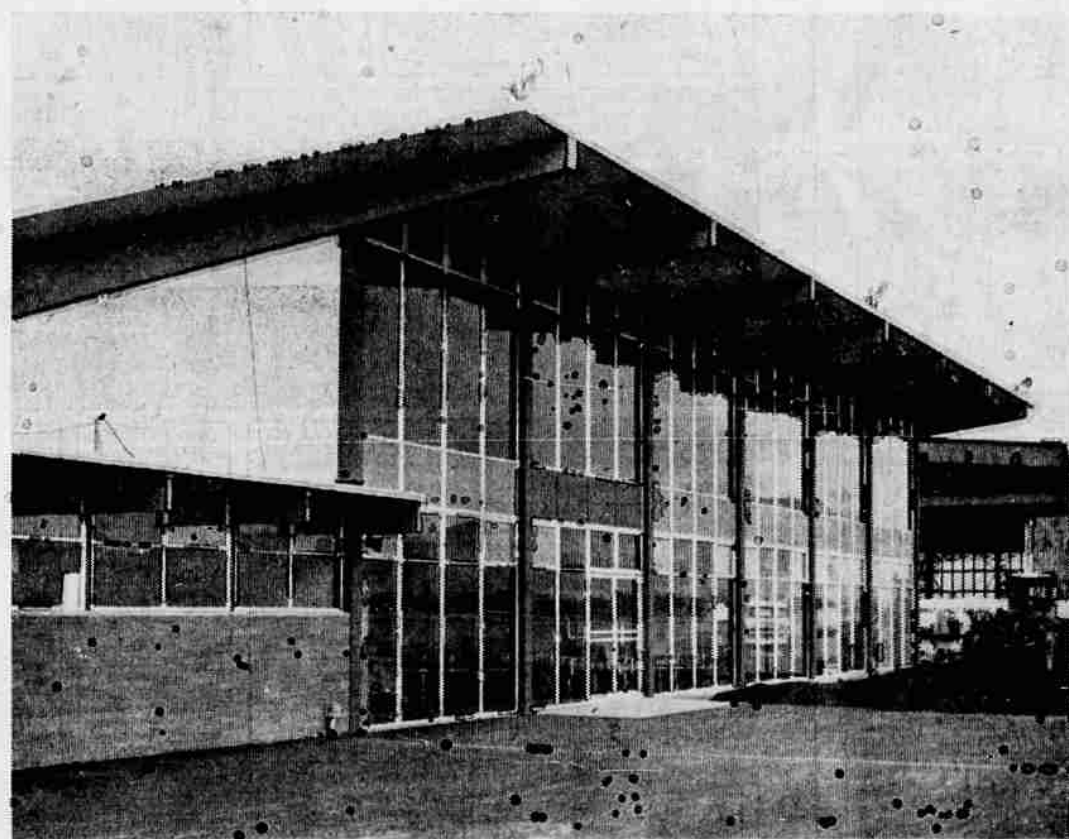

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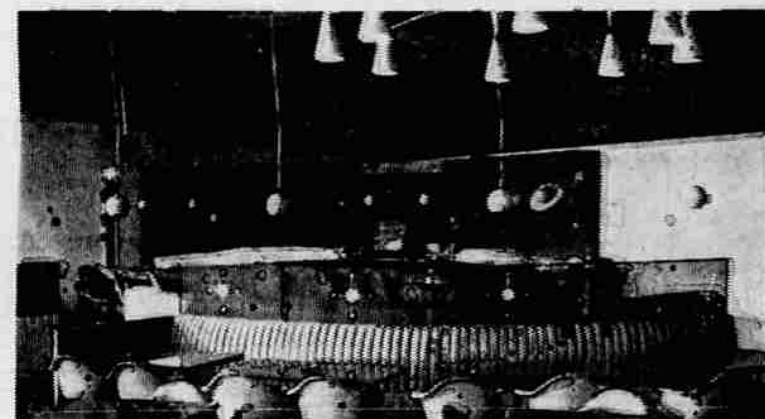
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
