# New Tax Levy Proposal Okayed By County Board

The County School District Budget Committee okayed a proposal Friday that would raise a new five-year serial tax levy of \$160,000 annually to step up its building program.

Superintendent Carrol Howe said that there are 345 more students in the district this year than last, and indicated he believed that enrollment would continue to expand.

"The district," he said, "has inadequate facilities in some places."  
For one instance, the old Summers School on Summers Lane probably will be reopened again next fall, as it has been off and on during recent years. It once was marked for disposition.

For another, Howe already has made arrangements to school some children in Bly in a church building, and he says some shunting is going to have to be done at Chiloquin to take care of pupils there.

The new levy will not replace the one now in effect which is supposed to yield \$190,000 annually, and will not terminate for another three years.

That levy seemed adequate when it was called for, said Howe, since an extensive study indicated growth would hold at a figure considerably lower than now is forecast.

It was earmarked mostly for long term building replacement so that the burden of modernization would not hit all at once.

The projected growth figures are based on growth during the past three years when there has been a buildup due to birth rate and new people moving into the district.

The regular general fund budget is up this year, too, but tax millage will be down a little, if income estimates are accurate. The district is asking taxpayers to vote a levy of \$1,270,713 for the 1960-61 year — less by \$12,771 than was voted for the 1959-60 fiscal year.

But the entire operating budget, exclusive of the serial levy, estimated at \$2,436,143 is higher than last year's by \$188,611. Howe says the district expects \$200,000 more in other receipts this year compared to last, so tax millage will be lower for the general fund.

He expects a sizable cash carryover this year, and increased income from other sources such as state basic school support and county school funds.

Millage, he expects, will run around 38.4 this year compared to 35.0 last year, but that figure could fluctuate. If anything, the projected millage will drop a little from the estimate, he says, because property value in the county district this year was set at \$45,276,829, and that might prove conservative.

If all the measures pass, the total increase in tax levy will amount to \$147,228.  
A lot of the increase is due to a raise budgeted for teacher salaries, and a request for "12 1/2" additional teachers needed to take care of enrollment gains.

Teacher salaries, as okayed by the county budget committee, will raise from \$100 per year for beginners to \$300 for teachers with advanced degrees, much experience, or both.

The complete budget breakdown will be published in the Herald and News March 28 and April 4. A public budget hearing will be conducted beginning at 3 p.m. April 14 at the superintendent's office, Veterans Memorial Building, on the county courthouse grounds.

Election date is May 2, 1960, and polling places are all district elementary school buildings. Voters must be registered with the county clerk prior to April 2 in order to be eligible to vote at the school election.

Others taking part in the program will be Col. Jack W. Williams, Kingsley Field Air Base commander, and Maury Clark, president of the Klamath Chapter Oregon Pilots Association.

City Councilman Floyd Wynne will be master of ceremonies.  
Construction on the two story building which replaced the old terminal building constructed during World War II was begun in July, 1959.

John Howard, Klamath Falls, was architect for the structure. Brostherous Construction Company was the building contractor.

Murch, who had spent the night with Joseph on the Lang ranch, said Joseph told him after the others left, "I'm gonna have to kill them to get rid of them."

The state rested its case shortly before 5 o'clock Friday afternoon, after two material witnesses each said Joseph had threatened the lives of Harry Deman, 56, and Okey Richards, 31.  
Joseph, a 32-year-old mason and ranchhand, is charged with first degree murder in both shootings last September 20. When his trial opened last week, Defense Attorney Freeman Murray said Joseph would not deny the shootings, but that self defense would bring the controversy.

Two arguments against self defense were offered by the state Friday in the testimony of Evans Renfro and Melvin Murch, material witnesses in the case.  
Renfro, returned here from Red Bluff, California, last Tuesday. Said he had visited the Delbert Lang ranch near Chiloquin — where Joseph lived in a cabin — on the morning before Deman and Richards were killed.  
Renfro, Deman and Richards arrived about 10 that Sunday morning and all had a few drinks. Renfro testified, But, before he, Deman, and Richards left, Renfro said, Joseph told him beyond hearing of the others, "I'm gonna have to kill them if they come back and wake me up."
