PORTLAND (AP) — The late Sen. Richard Neuberger (D-Ore.) left most of his estate to his widow, his sister, and three nieces.

Neuberger's will, admitted to probate here Monday, listed these principal beneficiaries:

To his sister, Mrs. James Goodsell, Neuberger left his interest in a house in Portland.

To his nieces, Ann, Katherine and Mollie Goodsell, each one-sixth of all bank deposits, stocks and bonds.

To his widow, Maurine, another house in Portland, and the remainder of the estate.

Neuberger also left books, files and documents to the Oregon State Library and the Jewish Community Center here.

No estimate was made of the estate's value.

Peacemaker Stab Victim

ARLINGTON, Mass. (AP) — A man attempting a peacemaker's role was stabbed to death in this quiet Boston suburb Monday night as he sought to avert a clash between teenage gangs.

Police rounded up four youths in neighboring Watertown and said all admitted a part in the killing.

Detectives sought six or eight more to be shown to witnesses in a police lineup.

All those involved, including the slain man, are white.

The victim was Franklin K. Theall, 26, an unmarried tree surgeon, left dying in a gutter 100 feet from his home.

Police said Theall's death appeared to be the climax of a series of battles between a gang from Watertown and Arlington youths.

Detectives said witnesses told them a dozen youths, "looking for trouble," entered a variety store where Theall was having coffee about 8:30 p.m. Theall, apparently fearing for the safety of girl customers and employees, ordered them out of the store.

The witnesses said the gang dragged Theall and two unidentified youths from the store, beat them unmercifully and stabbed Theall. They fled when James Bray, a friend, came to Theall's rescue.

Bray jotted down the registration of one of the three cars in which the gang fled. Police later found the car in Watertown and took its four occupants into custody.

Rabid Fox Hunt Becomes Fiasco

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — A neighborhood fox hunt in suburban Fair Oaks Sunday turned into a fiasco.

Billy Kaestner, 10, spotted the fox first. It bit him.

Adults shouted the fox, sought because it appeared ill, into the garage of Walter Van Horn and called the sheriff's office.

Deputies came and shot the fox with a sawed-off shotgun.

Some pellets went through the garage door and hit William D. Kaestner, Billy's father, in the head. He was 100 feet away and they caused only scalp wounds.

The fox was rabid, so Billy must undergo painful rabies shots.
