Fence Breaking Charge Dropped

A charge of breaking down a fence was dismissed in district court Tuesday after a brief trial for two defendants, Ben Mitchell of Klamath Falls and Leland Ortis of Chiloquin.

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Statement Refuted

Intense questioning about State's Exhibit Y—a statement murder suspect Michael Joseph dictated but did not sign—brought controversy in Joseph's murder trial Wednesday.

District Attorney Arthur Beddoe compared Joseph's trial testimony of Tuesday with the statement dictated in Beddoe's office the day after Joseph was arrested for first degree murder in the shooting deaths of Harry Berman, 36, and Okie Richards, 34, last September 20.

Each time Beddoe proposed a question after comparing his trial testimony notes with the typed statement, he and Joseph raised voices and pitched nearer and nearer a verbal battle. At least six times in the last hour of Tuesday's trial session, Joseph vigorously, then passionately, denied remarks Beddoe attributed to him from the written statement.

Finally, Joseph flared: "I deny that statement—that so-called statement. I deny the way it was written and I deny the way it's misconstrued. I deny the whole statement."

Beddoe accused Joseph of evading answers and of giving wandering testimony. Several times he asked Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg to instruct the witness to give direct answers.

At one point Freeman Murray, one of Joseph's two defense attorneys appointed by the court, accused Beddoe of putting words in Joseph's mouth. Joseph retorted, "He won't put any words in my mouth, don't worry about that."

The disputes centered on many points. The first occurred immediately when Beddoe asked Joseph if his true name was not Michael Joseph Godfrey. Joseph said both names were true names, and said he had dropped the Godfrey about five years ago.

Officers have not yet found the vandals responsible for damage to windows at the home of Fritz Hahn, 1342 Sargent Avenue, to a windshield of a car driven by Vin Neumann, Eugene, Tuesday night, and to a window of a home occupied by Martin Conlin, 1303 Upham Street, sometime during the last few days.

Hahn said someone threw a rock through his garage window. Neumann said he was driving at Ninth and Prospect streets when a heavy object crashed into his windshield, shattering it. Conlin said damage to his picture window was done with a BB or pellet gun.

Witnesses at the trial before Judge D. E. Van Vactor included Dayton Hude, who maintained the men cut his fence near the head of the Williamson River while on a fishing trip last December 17. Another witness was Charles Tucker of Chiloquin.

Following testimony, Attorney Richard Smith moved for a directed verdict of acquittal. The judge granted the motion and the men were released.

It was wonderful. But— Athens had an enemy. The enemy was Sparta.

The Spartans were rough, tough and competent. They too had slaves—in that period of the world captives were war booty. But they kept their slaves busy at CONSTRUCTIVE tasks such as tilling the fields, growing crops, etc.

The Spartans busied themselves with athletic exercises calculated to fit them for war. No playing in the sun for them.

Let's make it short. The rough, tough, competent Spartans conquered the easy-going, luxury-loving Athenians and the Golden Age of Athens came to an end.

That, I think, is the point Mayor Christopher was seeking to make in his speech after he got back from Russia.

Superior Judge James M. Allen, hearing the trial without jury, ruled last year that Mrs. Ballard must appear with financial records after having been subpoenaed by the state.
