Heir To Throne Named Andrew

LONDON (AP) — Britain's new royal baby has been named Andrew Albert Christian Edward, it was officially announced today.

He will be known as Prince Andrew. The first infant born to a reigning British monarch in 103 years, the boy is second in line to the British throne. Only his 11-year-old brother, Prince Charles, is ahead of him as a potential successor to his mother, who became the sovereign in 1952.

The boy was delivered at Buckingham Palace Feb. 19. He weighed 7 pounds, 3 ounces at birth.

More Evidence Assembled In Airplane Blast Probe

WILMINGTON, N.C. (AP)—Government investigators assembled today added bits of evidence today to probe that a bomb destroyed a big airliner with 34 aboard near here last Jan. 6.

Three witnesses remained to testify in the closing round of a Civil Aeronautics Board inquiry into the disaster.

All were expected to point more strongly than ever to New York attorney Julian A. Frank, 32, as the key figure in the bombing.

Frank carried more than a million dollars in life insurance.

It was indicated the witnesses would show how the distribution of the wreckage—and of human tissue—all but proved that the airplane explosion occurred in the part of the plane that Frank had occupied.

The CAB announced previously that a dynamite explosion touched off by a dry cell battery occurred inside the plane near a seat used by Frank.

Frank's body and some wreckage stained with explosive materials were found 20 miles from

the main part of the plane, where the bodies of the 33 other victims were located.

The new evidence scheduled to be introduced concerned the discovery inside the airplane wreckage of chips of bone and other parts of Frank's body, including a part of one of his missing legs.

Tuesday's evidence all pointed to normal functioning of the National Airlines plane and crew on a routine flight from New York to Miami, up to the time of the explosion.

The witnesses included: Frank T. Taylor of Washington, CAB power plant specialist—"We see nothing in the power plants

of any emergency action having been taken."

Walter A. Gonnard, an associate of Taylor — "A comprehensive study of the maintenance history of the airplane, its engines and propellers revealed no trend data that could be related to any structural weakness or deterioration."

Alexander G. Hardy, senior vice president of National, said there had been some reports that a propeller blade might have torn loose. Taylor said the position and condition of the engines and propellers foreclosed that possibility.

Robert I. Foster, Silver Spring, Md., Weather Bureau meteorologist, said the plane could not have

encountered more than light turbulence and light icing.

George A. Shoner, National's chief radio operator at Wilmington, and the last man to communicate with the pilot of the doomed airplane, said at no time did the

pilot indicate anything unusual was happening.

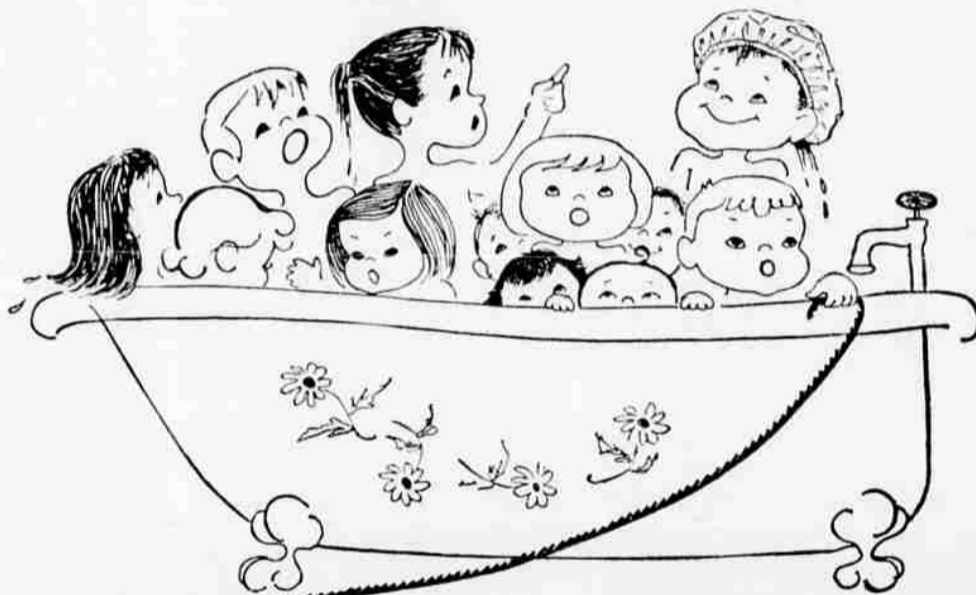

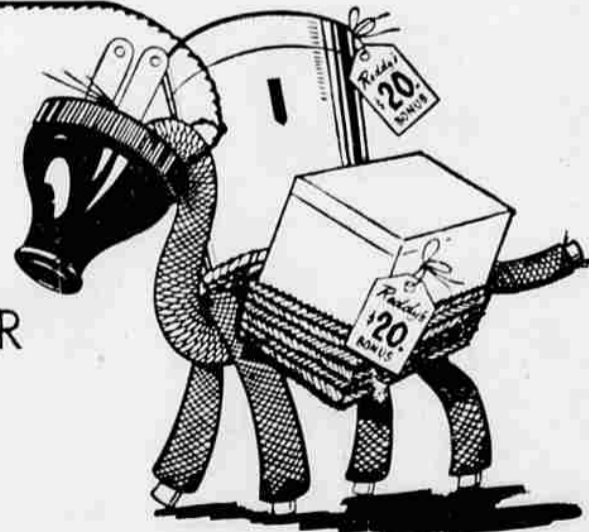
