That's a part of the biographical material FAMILY WEEKLY sometimes issues about me. I

met the admiral 15 years ago and I have never seen him since, but he has been one of my dearest friends all this time.

Admiral William Brent Young was paymaster general of the Navy when we met. He was secretary of Washington's famed Alfalfa Club and the Army-Navy Club. He and his wife, whose name was Patty, too, lived in Chevy Chase—and when I say "lived," I don't use the word lightly.

He burst on my doorstep like an Atlas missile. He was well over six feet up and down, and possibly side to side. His bald head glistened like his gold braid. A man who looked like that was born to be an admiral.

He ate my mother's fried chicken with his fingers and mouth full. He really did the dishes, to our enchanted chagrin. He wrapped a tea towel around his brass buttons and attacked the sink with utter disregard for the safety of the Haviland.

When, like Santa Claus, he vanished, I got my first break as a writer. I told the story, very badly, of the admiral in our kitchen and sent him the clipping. His Patty hung it in her kitchen as a constant reminder to him to do unto her dishes as he had done unto ours.

He sent me a portrait of himself and so began the long years of our letters. His replies to my adventures were masterpieces of warmth and wit and gently ribald humor.

After his retirement, there was no change in him. He was a part of the Washington whirl, eating massively, loving life, and writing that love to me.

It's been months since we exchanged our usual reports. I knew he must have aged in the 15 years. I knew he must have exchanged gold braid for gabardine and come to exist more on memories than action.

Yet this enormous, delightful, charming man is a symbol to me of how all admirals should be—a little larger than life-size.

So I choose not to believe what I learned last week.
