EGLIN AIR FORCE BASE, Fla. (AP) — A GAM-77 Hound Dog missile was fired successfully over the Atlantic Test Range by a B52 jet bomber.
The 51-foot missile streaked several hundred miles downrange before impacting in the Atlantic Ocean Thursday. It was fired from beneath the wing of a B52 and was guided by its own navigation system.
The air-to-surface missile carried several hundred pounds of test equipment.
It was the 10th test flight of a Hound Dog in a current program.

Everyone Under Tension, Says Prison Psychologist

Editor's Note: Albert P. Balevire, 36, a psychologist with the Tennessee Department of Mental Health, helped persuade convicts Charles Raymond Farra and Robert Rivera to surrender after they seized 10 hostages at the state prison in Nashville. Balevire worked from the inside as a liaison man between prison officials and the two convicts.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (UPI)—During the last 15 minutes Farra and Rivera were deliberating very seriously whether to give in or fight it out.

Rivera, of course, was won over long before, but he still was withholding his decision pending Farra's Farra thought for some time. He sat down, then would get up, just thinking — lighting a cigarette within himself, whether to turn the 45 over.

Interestingly enough, Rivera after Raymond turned over the automatic to me, was a little reluctant to disarm himself. While he still had the pistol he motioned some of the hostages out. I'm pleading with him to give me the pistol. He said no Rivera let all the guards out, then he handed over the 45.

He said he wanted to make sure all the guards got out first. Then Rivera handed the gun to me, and also a knife.

Both convicts were considerably nervous. We were all pretty much in the same boat at that time, even me. Everyone was under tension.

I thought Farra would give in all alone. The actual breaking point came when Rivera decided he would think about the proposals made by the commissioner of corrections and the warden. Then Farra began to weaken.

Rivera would have been up much earlier if it hadn't been for Farra. Not Wednesday night, but much sooner.

Both these fellows never had an argument during the entire time they were very loyal to each other. They were very scrupulous about not letting each other down. That's where the waiting came in. Farra didn't try to hurt anyone.
