Some All-Americans Make It; Some Of Them Really Fold

NEW YORK (UPI) — The All-America selectors finally had a field day this season and the three seniors on everybody's "all" quintet will be the first three players chosen in the pro draft April 11.

Oscar Robertson of Cincinnati will go first, to the Cincinnati Royals. Jerry West of West Virginia will be selected second by the Minneapolis Lakers with Darrall Imhoff of Klamath going to the New York Knickerbockers as the third team to make a choice of the collegians newly available.

It's in the eye-popping realm of walking across the Hudson on July 4.

Many Notable Busts
There have been many notable busts in the pro ranks. Many more recognize their defects and settle for the less pressurized competition of AAU company-sponsored basketball. Even in an era in which college basketball has risen to new heights, with a general overall strengthening of the caliber of play, the false All-America still manages to survive.

The pros quickly separate the press clippings from the actual potential.

Thus when they name Robertson, West and Imhoff as their three draft choices, the All-American selectors can take a deep bow even though it only serves to prove that even a near-sighted pig will find an acorn once in a while.

Others Go Early
Sure to go early in the pro draft are a flock of other graduating college stars who didn't "make" the All-America first teams. The other two first team berths generally were awarded to Jerry Lucas of Ohio State and Tom Stith of St. Bonaventure.

But the pros, letting those two summer for another season or two, according to pro regulations, will be drafting such as Len Wilkins of Providence, Jim Hagan of Tennessee Tech, Tom Sanders of NYU, Lee Shaffer of North Carolina, Jackie Moreland of Louisiana Tech, Jim Mudd of North Texas State, Ralph Davis of Cincinnati and Bill (Pickles) Kennedy of Temple.

Jacksonville and Knoxville set a South Atlantic League record in 1959 by playing a 21-inning game. Jacksonville won, 3-2.

Midwesterns Cop College Bowl Crown

TOLEDO, Ohio (UPI) — Midwest bowlers walked off with most of the honors Sunday night in the second annual intercollegiate bowling championships held here in conjunction with the ABC tournament.

Jerry Constantino of Bradley University was a double winner, sharing the two-man crown with Eugene Wodka of the University of Illinois, and taking the all-events championship with an 1189 total.

The singles title was won by Jim Nixon of the University of Minnesota with a 604.

The doubles combination of Constantino and Wodka bowled a creditable 1249 with the Bradley star hitting 635 and Wodka 594. In the singles, Constantino had 334.

This was the second straight year Bradley bowlers won the all-events, as Fred Marcussen of the Peoria, Ill., school won last in St. Louis.

Jim Davis of Pace College, New York City, was second in the singles with 594 and Wodka third with 558. Robert Killian of Michigan State paired with John Altig of Ohio University for second in the doubles with 1130. Second in all-events went to Wodka with 1182 and Nixon was third with 1150.

The 29 finalists represented an original field of 6500 college bowlers who competed in qualifying trials around the nation.

The only major change in regular ABC play came in the booster team division when the Brannon Boosters No. 2 team from McKee's Rocks, Pa., rolled a 28-22 total for first place.

The Brannon No. 1 boosters had rolled into second place Friday night with a 27-25 score.

The Brannon team finished its series with a 10-9 game, the second highest in ABC tournament history by a booster team. Booster competition is limited to teams with an 850 or under average.
