**Families With Many Woes Spawn Delinquent Youths**

WASHINGTON (UPI) — A New York City official said today the overwhelming majority of juvenile delinquents come from a relatively small number of families that are demoralized by desertion, divorce, alcoholism, ignorance and poverty.  
Youth Commissioner Ralph W. Whelan said New York analyzed its growing delinquency problem and found that 75 per cent of the cases could be traced to "approximately 20,000 multi-problem families" which constitute "less than one per cent of the city's family population."  
"There is every reason to believe that this ratio applies throughout the nation," he told the White House Conference on Children and Youth.  
**Communities Can Help**  
Whelan said American communities can do something about delinquency whenever they are willing to come to grips with the complex and sordid problems of the families in which it breeds.

"The shocking reality is that most of these families are known to a variety of public and private social agencies, but their needs are still not being met or their problems solved," he said.  
The New York official said the families which most need community help are often rejected by social agencies because they are regarded as "unreachable or hopeless."  
Delinquency—its extent, causes and cures — was a main preoccupation of the 7,000 delegates on the third day of the week-long White House conference on youth problems.
