

Missile Port For Subs Dedicated

CHARLESTON, S.C. (AP)—The first port for arming the deadly ballistic missile Polaris submarines was dedicated here today.

Missiles will be assembled, checked out, stored or loaded aboard the fleet ballistic submarines at the new facility. It is built on an 800-acre reservation seven miles up the Cooper River from Charleston harbor.

Rep. Mendel Rivers (D-SC) said in a speech prepared for the dedication that "this base will only become completely successful in its operation if it is never utilized for its ultimate purpose."

Rivers, member of the House Armed Services Committee, said "like the fire extinguisher, in our home, like a doctor on emergency call, like the fire insurance we obtain, we hope we will never see this base put to its wartime use."

The Defense Department has declined to say whether the hydrogen warheads of the Polaris missiles will be stored here.

Nineteen officers and 200 enlisted men, plus about 100 engineers who will act as technical advisers, will staff the assembly plant. Cmdr. Harry C. Cox, a specialist in naval ordnance and a native of Hemingway, S.C., will be in command.

The Polaris missile, to be fired from submerged nuclear submarines, will have an initial operations range of about 1,350 statute miles. The missiles have been fired more than 900 miles in tests.

The nuclear-powered George Washington was commissioned last December and now is in operation. The second of the Polaris subs, the Patrick Henry, is scheduled to join the fleet before the end of this year.

Allowance Given To Flynn Girls

LOS ANGELES (AP)—The late Errol Flynn's daughters Deirdre, 14, and Rory, 12, have been awarded allowances of \$100 a month apiece.

They will be paid out of \$30,000 in insurance left by the swash-buckling actor who died Oct. 14 at the age of 50. Superior Court approved the payments Monday after attorneys for the girls' mother, Nora Eddington Flynn Haymes, said the value of the actor's estate still hasn't been determined.

Her husband, George Kimes, 36, paroled bank robber-murderer, has been in Nez Perce County Jail here since Dec. 14 charged with assault with a deadly weapon.

Conviction would mean return to the Oklahoma Penitentiary, where he has already spent more than 30 years on murder and armed robbery convictions.

The Oklahoma badman turned

vacuum cleaner salesman said Sunday "I'd rather die than go back. That would be for the rest of my life."

The man, Kimes, is accused of stabbing Earl Fish, 41, Spokane, Wash., has recovered from chest wounds and has asked that the charge be dropped. Prosecutor Owen L. Knowlton said he intends to do this during the week.

Kimes has been in a cell for more than 100 days without re-

questing a preliminary hearing, intensely awaiting a decision on his case.

Kimes is certain now he has put his criminal past behind him. He has the promise of a job as sales crew leader for a vacuum cleaner firm at Walla Walla, Wash.

of his wife, Kimes said, "She always said she thought there was some good in me, if I could ever get out and have a chance to

prove it."

George and his brother Matt were convicted of murder in the 1926 shooting of Sequoyah County deputy Perry Clumulate, during a gun battle. A 30-year sentence followed for a bank robbery. He takes pride in never revealing who

the brother's bank robbing partners were.

"If I was fool enough to play, I was man enough to pay," he said.

He was labeled as "one of the best prisoners we've ever had here," by jail officials.
