

Missile Men End Walkout

VANENBERG AIR FORCE BASE, Calif. (AP)—A walkout of more than 3,000 construction workers ended Tuesday night at this base—the only U.S. installation with operational long-range missiles.

The walkout began Monday when the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers complained that the Philco Corp., was bringing in tradesmen to work for less than the prevailing journeyman electrician's wage, \$4.35 an hour.

The walkout ended when negotiators agreed to hold up work on the project at issue pending further discussion of the dispute. Only about 25 or so workmen are affected, the Air Force said.

Senators Consider Remedy For Employment Situation

WASHINGTON (AP)—A special Senate committee said today that unemployment is a grave national problem requiring comprehensive remedial action before an exploding population makes it worse.

Both Democratic and Republican members of the study committee headed by Sen. Eugene J. McCarthy (D-Minn.) shared concern over the jobless problem. They said an expected 13½-million jump in the labor force in the next decade puts a premium on economic development to provide more jobs.

Although employment generally is high, joblessness in some areas affects up to 25 per cent, or one out of every four potential workers.

The Democratic majority differed from the Republican minority on method, but both agreed that a broad and deliberate attack on the jobless problem is vital to make full use of the nation's manpower resources. This is particularly true, the group reported, because of the Soviet Union's rapid development.

The Democratic majority urged revised fiscal and other government policies to stimulate economic growth; broad aid to economically distressed areas; nationwide unemployment insurance standards for higher benefits over longer periods; federal relief grants to states; job retraining; emphasis on channeling federal projects to depressed areas; a stronger employment service; and standby anti-recession legislation for public works, community facilities and housing.

The Republican minority called for a federal-state action program involving federal loans, grants and study funds and coordination. One of the GOP recommendations was for moving some government agencies from Washington to "low-cost areas where labor is available." The minority suggested a regular standby system for supplementary federal unemployment benefits.

The special Senate Committee on Unemployment Problems was established last year on motion of Majority Leader Lyndon B. Johnson of Texas. The nine-man group, six Democrats and three Republicans, conducted hearings in a dozen states.

The committee's report said that while there has been no mass

unemployment in recent years there has been severe class unemployment—wherein thousands of Americans suffer long-term involuntary idleness because of age, race, lack of proper training, obsolescence of once-valued skills, or machine displacement of human labor.

The committee said the "baby bulge" is about to begin. This is the big crop of war babies, born after World War II and now coming to working age.

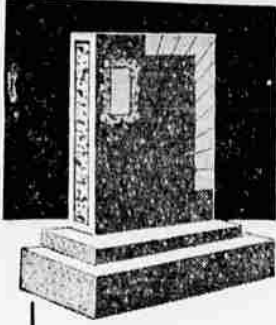
CRIPPLED PLANE SAFE

SHANNON, Ireland (UPI)—An American DC4 airliner landed safely at Shannon Airport Tuesday night after limping across one third of the Atlantic Ocean on three engines.

Seven crew members and five company personnel were aboard the Seven Seas Co. plane bound from Newark, N.J., to Amsterdam. A port side engine failed a thousand miles off the Irish coast.

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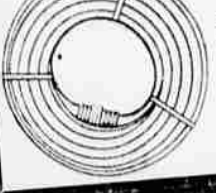
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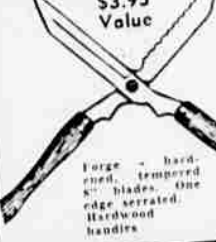


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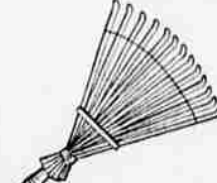
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
