A DIFFERENT DATE SAUCE
Pit and slice fresh California dates; drizzle with orange juice and sprinkle with cinnamon. Let stand several hours then fold into stiffly beaten cream sweetened to taste. Spoon onto warm spice or chocolate cake or gingerbread.

COIFFURE

From New York to Paris the fashion world is agog over a revolution in hair styling, the "Bob Cap" which Michel of Helen Rubinstein designed for and introduced so dramatically at the Galanos Spring opening. Harking back to the controversial Shingle of the '20s, yet feminine and wearable in the idiom of the '60s, Michel's "Bob Cap" is like so many of his styles already is being hailed and copied by hairdressers the world over.

"I wanted to capture the spirit of the '20s," Michel says, "in tune with the fluid look of today's fashions. The 'Bob Cap' has that saucy air of independence, but is a long way from the 'plastered' look of the early version."

This exciting new coiffure has variations — all soft, rounded and oh, so feminine, young, easy-to-handle and well-groomed. Although no single length is dictated, hair is short, with a head-bugging shape achieved by Michel's new "under cut." Underneath layers of hair are cut short to hug the nape of the neck, while the top layer is all one length from crown to nape, projected into an egg-shaped fullness capping the back of the head.

Sides feature forward curved crescent tips, cut three to four inches in length. In a quarter-moon design, they touch the cheekbone, tip the eyelid or feather prettily on the cheek like exclamation points. Bangs, too, are treated in a new way as, from a slightly lifted crown, they tip the eyebrows in a smooth, crescent, cover the forehead in a full "Dutch Boy" or rest on the brow in a half-moon dip.

Not shape alone, but color, too, makes news this season, with the emphasis on the brown family. In keying with spring fashion colors, Michel suggests hair shades deepening from light brown (almost blonde) into full, rich black-brown (minus red). Temporary color can be rinsed in with Helen Rubinstein's "Color Lift," a more lasting change with her "Crowning Color" Cream Tint. Both are available in a wide range of natural-looking shades.
