



Certificates For Service Given Four

A Certificate of Exemplary Service was recently presented to Capt. Terry L. Ogilvie Jr., commander, 2034th AACS Detachment, Kingsley Field, and three airmen, T.Sgt. Buster Blair, S.Sgt. William F. Proctor, and A2C Gary R. Haskins by Maj. Gordon R. Wren, commander, 2034th AACS Squadron, Mather Air Force Base, California.

The certificate was presented as "evidence and recognition of extraordinary dedication to duty and application of knowledge in the field of Air Traffic Control."

On December 22, 1959, the pilot of an F-101B Voodoo interceptor from Hamilton Air Force Base, California, flying above an overcast sky in the vicinity of Kingsley Field, reported to the base control tower operator that he was low on fuel and his navigation equipment wasn't functioning properly. Through the use of Ground Control Approach (GCA) facilities at Kingsley Field, this pilot and plane valued at more than two million dollars was brought in for a safe landing.

Again, on January 6, 1960, a civilian Twin Beech, valued at approximately \$70,000 was saved when the pilot reported he was extremely low on fuel and the plane's instruments, used in flying in bad weather, were not functioning.

Navy Plans New Program

The Navy recruiting station here today announced a new program designed to enlist and train officers for airborne jobs.

Under the plan, radar operators in interceptor-fighter craft, bombardiers, navigators, bombardier navigators, airborne early warning or anti-submarine warfare personnel, electronics counter measures evaluators, maintenance or electronic maintenance and ordnance officers will get hazardous duty pay at the same rate as pilot officers.

The Navy hopes to get most of its recruits for the program from college graduates. Candidates will go directly to the naval school of pre-flight at the air station, Pensacola, Florida, rather than to officer candidate school in Newport, Rhode Island.

Bring Outdoors To Your Table

You can bring springtime indoors even before the season of outdoor dining begins.

Now is a good time to brighten up table settings, to be in tune with the new season. It's easy to do on your sewing machine, with the aid of some pretty fabric and a dash of imagination.

Leaf place mats will dress your table up for spring. Local sewing center experts suggest leaf-shaped mats of green linen or any crisp fabric such as Indianhead cotton, with stems curled over to form built-in napkin rings. Back the fabric with green lawn or organdy. To assure uniform size and shape for the mats, draw a paper pattern on brown wrapping paper or even newspaper, allowing a half-inch for seams and sufficient stem length to make the napkin rings.

Stitch around outer edges of the leaf, using a pyramid stitch on your automatic sewing machine or on your zigzag attachment. Set the machine for a narrow satin stitch to outline the stem and to trace leaf veins through the mat. When stitching is completed, trim away excess fabric around out-

side of leaf and stem, cutting around stitch pattern.

Napkins may be simply finished with a narrow satin stitch. Here again, when stitching is completed, excess fabric is trimmed away.

These leaf place mats make an effective table setting when combined with pale green dishes and sparkling crystal. A centerpiece of spring flowers completes the picture. These mats are perfect for any luncheon party indoors, and may be used later for your outdoor table.

Once you've started, you'll find it's fun to invent decorative place mats, shaped like flowers or fruit, to carry out any table color scheme you may fancy. For an Easter table, Easter egg mats are gay and easy to make—egg-shaped ovals in varied pastel colors. For any spring occasion, yellow-and-white daisy mats are effective. And for all the special holidays of the year you can have appropriate place mats—red, white and blue for the Fourth of July, pumpkin shapes for Halloween and Thanksgiving, holly leaves with embroidered red berries for Christmas.

Give your imagination full play, and have the gayest table in town.



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
