Truck Driver Given Okay

DETROIT (AP) — A Windsor, Ont., truck driver, kept from entering the United States because he stole six cans of pork and beans 50 years ago, had the judicial menu wiped clean Tuesday.

Walter S. Umphress, 50, was denied a visa to enter the United States because he was convicted in April 1910 at Calgary, Alta., for the theft and served 60 days. Umphress appealed to the Alberta Supreme Court to have his record expunged. The court agreed.

Now, Umphress says he plans to apply again—this time for a permanent immigration visa.

Life On Farm Not Simple, Conclave Speakers Claim

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP)—Like a lot of us city slickers, you've probably hankered for a long time to settle down on a farm and live the quiet, simple life. But speakers at a week-long conference on farm credit indicate that it's anything but quiet, and their statistics indicate it's anything but simple.

Farmers, like some of the rest of us, are up to their ears in debt — and if they're not, they just can't keep up with the agricultural Joneses. The problem, as outlined by various speakers, is that farming is now a big business, and it has to be financed like big business. The little guy apparently faces tough hoeing.

Take this note from Lee R. Martin, of the University of Arkansas Department of Agricultural Economics.

"There seems to be general agreement among our profession that we aren't going to need—even by 1975—the additional production that increased efficiency in Southern agriculture will bring us."

To make his point, Martin said, "Let us commence with some elementary considerations of capital." Then, he added, "We take as the production function 'Y equals F (X1, X2, X3, Xn)'. This is a formula to show that farm income is related to productivity times the increment to income per acre of land used. Remember what we said about

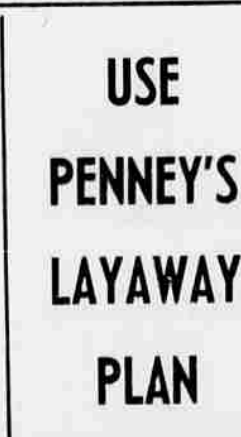
