

Site Changed; Opening Set

The grand opening at Baker's Landscape Nursery, 6200 South Sixth Street, Saturday and Sunday, April 2 and 3, will introduce a new business location for the firm to former and future customers. Former home of the nursery was at 3616 South Sixth.

Mr. and Mrs. Alan (Leona) Baker, who took over the nursery and landscaping business from Mr. and Mrs. Al Nyback, owners of Flower Fair, have established their nursery headquarters on three acres of land in the south suburban area, purchased from William and Henry Wong. In addition to the nursery business, the family home has been built on the property.

A 12,000-square-foot display area under lath and an easily accessible yard display area will contain a wide variety of trees, shrubs, bedding plants and vegetable garden plants in season.

In announcing plans for the firm, Baker said eventually the owners will offer a complete garden center including farm and garden equipment. Presently the staff will offer landscaping and spray services, will install lawn sprinklers, and plant lawns.

Garden supplies, light tools, insecticides, sprays, fertilizers and new ideas in garden novelties are available.

Baker trained for his field with three years of study in landscape designing and horticulture at California State Polytechnic at Pomona. Since then he has had wide experience in the nursery business at Santa Ana, Long Beach, Pasadena, La Canada, California, and in Klamath Falls.

The present nursery staff includes seven assistants.

Fire Season Opening Set

SALEM—The 1960 forest fire season gets under way on April 1 and on that date the various forest laws covering precautionary measures within the forest areas and also the issuance of burning permits become effective, according to a statement issued by State Forester D. L. Phipps.

Burning permits will be required for any slash disposal operations or debris burning within or near any forest land, the forester stated. He indicated that the required permits can be secured from the nearest state forestry department headquarters or field station or from the nearest forest service official.

All logging operations will be required to provide tools suitable for fighting forest fires, equipment machinery with spark arresters, provide watchman service and carry out other protective measures as indicated by the inspectors.

"Forest closures during periods of low humidities will be conducted on the same modified regulations as of last year," Phipps said.

"These closures will be made upon the basis of findings by the field men. It often occurs, especially during the early fire season, that humidities can be low and the fire hazard will not justify closure on account of the high moisture content of the material on the forest floor. Hence, the old regulation of humidity closures in western Oregon on the 30 per cent basis will not be in effect."

Phipps stated that several of the protective organizations have already been called out on fires. In spite of recent moist conditions, the hazard can become very high in a short period of time, especially in open slash areas on open fern hillsides. A few hours of sunshine can contribute to a very serious fern fire, he said.

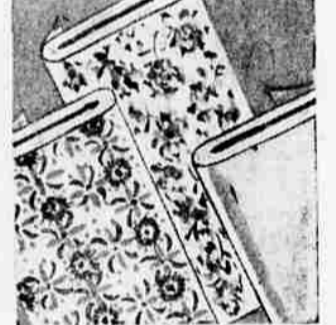

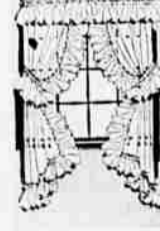
