Russian Stylists Show Cooperative Fashions

WASHINGTON (AP)—Unlike the euthroath competition of Western fashion designers, Russia says its style setters "pool their ideas and models at annual shows."

Fashions of 1960 in the Soviet Union—displayed by trim, slim models—were pictured for Americans in a three-page layout in the current issue of the exchange magazine, *USSR*.

"This season," writes Central Fashion House designer Lyudmila Turchanovskaya, "Soviet women favor the dress belted at the waistline. Large off-the-neck collars are very much in vogue. Very popular, too, are fur stoles, capes and coats, as well as fur trimmed suits."

The article reports there are 24 fashion houses in Russia's larger cities. The leading houses in cities like Moscow, Leningrad, Kiev and

Riga send their patterns to dress factories elsewhere in the country.

The Central Fashion House in Moscow, it says, designs about 3,000 styles every year, the majority of which are for mass production.

The models, in traditional poses, were pictured in a variety of dresses from an off-the-shoulder short length black silk embroidered evening gown to slacks with crew neck sweater. Also shown was an eye-catching sport jacket of wool and goatskin from Uzbekistan, worn with a belt.

The footwear ranged from loafers, worn with slacks, to pointed-toe shoes in a variety of heel heights.

The Russian fashion display didn't overlook the men. It included "the most popular business suit this season," single-breasted with narrow lapels, shown with a light-colored tie. It was described as being "worn with a warm vest of harmonizing color."

The Open Back Makes Comeback

NEW YORK (NEA)—It's back to the 1930s for the resort fashions of 1960. Yachting separates, beach pajamas, bareback dresses and dresses cut bias for flattery are all echoes of another era.

But where the fashions of the 1930s bypassed the figure in certain places, the new clothes play up a pretty figure. Bare midriffs, bare backs, side slits to reveal pretty legs and back slashes which show off apricot skin are all very much 1960 fashions, too.

In dresses, swimsuits and beach pajamas, the back will be bared to the waist. This means that the halter neck and narrow straps are back in favor.

Many of the new resort fashions are cut on the bias from silk and crepe fabrics which hang softly. Some of these are worn with straight-hanging jackets cut with a continental look. For these, blue and white are favored colors with sometimes just a dash of red.

The pleated skirt, most often in white flannel, will be seen at all resorts. It will be worn with an overblouse or with a jacket-like cashmere sweater in white or pastel.

Color emphasizes dazzling white. This is true for daytime on into evening and for prints with white backgrounds. Pastels are combined with stronger colors (pale blue with deeper blue) for daytime and the true pastels are kept for evening wear. There are many brilliant pastels, the strong limes and lemons and pinks, for daytime wear.
