

Oscar Hits For 29

Peoria Cats, All-Americas Win Friday

DENVER (AP)—Oscar Robertson and All-America Jerry West poured in 51 points between the two to bury Akron, Ohio's AAU Wingfoots 103-88 in Friday night's second round of US Olympic Basketball trials before 8,500 at the Denver Coliseum.

Peoria, winner of the 1952 Olympic trials, broke out of a 9-9 tie on the shooting of 6-6 Tom Meschery of St. Mary's (Calif.) and never trailed the rest of the way in beating the NAIA small college stars 89-63.

Ohio State's NCAA champions,

spilled by the NAIA club 76-69 in the first round, bounced back with an 89-79 consolation victory over the NCAA All Stars coached by Arad McCutchan.

Bartlesville, Okla., champion of the AAU's national industrial league, conquered the Armed Forces Stars 88-74.

The championship game sent Peoria's closely knit Cats against one of the greatest collections ever of college stars. Besides Robertson, who hit 29 points Friday night, and West, who bagged 22, the NCAA university unit included two other AP All-Americans: 6-11 Darrall Imhoff of California and Tony Jackson of St. Johns (N.Y.).

Against that array of talent, Peoria sent 6-8 Bob Boozer, 6-9 Don Plunkett and 6-9 John Prudhoe as well as fine outside shooters in Don Oll, Al Kelley and Howie Crittenden.

Warren Womble, Peoria coach, led the Cats to the Olympic trials championship in 1952 and coached the U.S. Olympic champs that year. The Cats have compiled a sizzling 33-30, 6-10 record in tournament play since 1951.

In that time they have won five AAU championships.

John Havlicek swished 26 points in guiding Ohio State to its consolation triumph over the NCAA stars. All-America Jerry Lucas snared 22 rebounds and scored 13 points.

Burdie Halderson canned 17 points and Jerry Shipp 15 in smoothing Bartlesville's way to the victory over the Armed Forces. Individual honors went to Jim Smith of the servicemen with 18.

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Medford Keglers Set Pace In KF Tourney

Medford entrants in the Golden West Handicap Tournament now in progress on Klamath Falls Bowling Lanes bowled away had all the best of it in standings released March 29.

Of eight possible categories in the tournament, the Medford kegglers commanded top spots in six.

Klamath Falls bowlers were in command, by narrow margins, in both the men's and women's doubles, but the valley entrants topped the team, singles and all-events in both the classes.

Rod Bortis and Gene Cook combined for a 1254 in the men's doubles, just one pin better than the total collected by Blaine Bratton and Larry Sowell. Medford's Bill Howell and Art Brooks trailed in third by 10 pins.

Betty Flynn and Verna Scott piled up an 1124 total, just one better than that of Shirley Daigle and Vivian Knox of Medford.

In team events to date the Medford Bowling Lanes team has a 3166 to its credit while Klamath Falls Side-Winders are next with 3089. On the distaff side of the team action Rogue Equipment of Medford is first with 2790 as compared to the second place Park Cabinet Shop's 2684. Klamath Falls teams hold the third place slots in both men and women's competition.

Sowell is second in men's singles with 669 behind Medford's Dick Weber who has a 676. Bratton is number two in the men's all-events with 1096 behind Bill Newland of Medford who has piled up a 1962.

Marilyn Sigmund of Klamath Falls is number two in the ladies' singles with 589, while Scott is second in the women's all-event with a 1743.

AUSTIN, Tex. (UPI) — John Macy shrugged off his new collegiate record in the 3000-meter run today and made plans to lead the University of Houston to a new American record in the four-mile relay of the 33rd Texas Relays.

"It wasn't my best race ... I could have won it 19 seconds faster," the slight, 30-year-old Polish refugee said.

The relays opened impressively Friday night with five new records going into the books, and one old standard equaled.

Olympians Bobby Morrow and Eddie Southern showed improved form in their specialties, the 100-meter dash and the 400-meter hurdles—events they won in the 1956 games.
