Chemist Delivers Talk To Highway Engineers

TULELAKE — W. E. Greene, owner and general manager of Oregon Agricultural Chemicals here, was guest speaker at the 1960 Northwest Highway Engineering Conference at Oregon State College, Corvallis, March 23-25.

Engineers, contractors and administrators from cities, counties and states of California, Oregon, Washington and Montana were present at the meeting. Sponsors were the Department of Civil Engineering, Oregon State College, Oregon State Highway Commission, Highway Department, Institute of Traffic Engineers, Bureau of Public Roads, League of Oregon Cities and the Association of Oregon Counties.

Other organizations assisting included the University of Washington, Washington Highway Commission, the Association of Wash-

ington Counties and Oregon Automobile Association.

Greene's talk, "The Magic Wand of Chemical Vegetation Control," touched on the latest methods for weed and brush control and told of some of the problems encountered in programs throughout the Northwest.

Telling the group not to think of chemicals as a magic wand, but as a closely engineered tool, to be used correctly for cost efficiency and best results, Greene stressed the importance of properly training crews to do the job correctly.

"An outstanding example of what can be accomplished in a

long range control program, is basic. Reports should be given before and after," with pictures to the monetary control. Data should be given to them, so that they can answer for these expenditures showing savings and the improved highway appearance."

Panel discussions as well as talks were featured during the three day conference.
