Big Primary Election Opens Up In Wisconsin

Wisconsin Primary at a Glance

Contests at stake—30 delegate votes at Democratic National Convention.

Thirty delegate votes at Republican National Convention.

One additional vote at Democratic convention will be split between two national committee members from Wisconsin.

Candidates—Delegate slates pledged to Sen. John F. Kennedy (D-Mass) and Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey (D-Minn) are on Democratic ballot.

Richard M. Nixon is on Republican ballot. Voters receive both ballots, can vote on either without identifying their party affiliation.

Voting hours—Polls in cities open at 7 a.m. close at 8 p.m. Central Standard Time.

Polls in rural areas open at 9 a.m., close at 5:30 p.m.

Probable vote—Approximately one million.

Eligible voters—2,300,000.

Voting districts—3,455 precincts, 10 congressional districts.

A candidate can capture the majority of the popular vote in the election but still lose the delegate contest because delegates are elected by congressional districts and sparsely populated areas carry as much weight in delegate strength as heavily settled regions.

Weather—Partly cloudy with temperatures between 40 and 50.

MILWAUKEE (AP)—The nation's first big presidential primary election opened today in Wisconsin, putting the hopes of three main contenders to the acid test of the ballot box.

The polls opened at 7 a.m. and the total ballot was expected to exceed the record of one million-plus cast in 1952.

The weatherman predicted fair skies and a warm day.

Election interest was at a fever pitch, stirred in large part by the appearance of a religious issue and the hard-fought campaigns of two Democratic candidates.

One of them, Sen. John Kennedy of Massachusetts, said his zero hour is at hand today. "If I

am beaten," he said, "I'm out."

Kennedy is considered the leading candidate for the Democratic presidential nomination and the favorite to win the election in Wisconsin.

His opponent, Sen. Hubert Humphrey of Minnesota, says he won't quit the race, regardless of today's outcome.

Vice President Richard M. Nixon is running unopposed on the Republican ballot. He did not campaign in Wisconsin. Nevertheless, his showing will be compared to that of the Democratic candidates and the votes cast for GOP aspirants in previous Wisconsin primaries.

A great deal will become clear after the polls close at 8 p.m.

As the only GOP candidate, Nixon already has the 30 delegates to the Republican National Convention.

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)—Search for two missing private airplanes believed down somewhere in Northern California has been abandoned. But a widespread hunt for a third craft continues.

Civil Air Patrol planes continued searching for a Piper Comanche which vanished March 27 while enroute from Santa Ana to Marysville.

Aboard the plane were Joe McHale, Haverton, Pa., and Ben Guthrie, Groville.

Abandoned were searches for a Cessna 172, which disappeared March 23 on flight from Modesto to San Carlos; and a Stinson Voyager, which vanished March 25 while traveling from San Jose to Redding.

The Modesto-San Carlos plane carried Frank Rivera, San Carlos; Don Hyde, Belmont, and Mrs. Hilda Mirmo, Palo Alto.

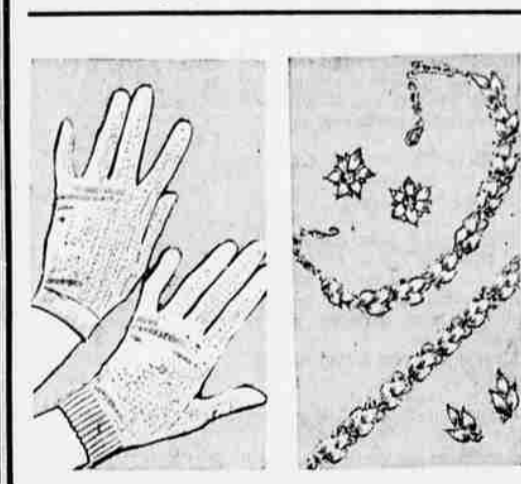
