

Reorganize, NW Group Informed

OCEANLAKE (AP)—An official of the Redwood Empire Assn., Northern California counterpart to the Oregon Coast Assn., suggested Monday night the Oregon group reorganize so it can better promote tourism.

Don Clauson, executive board member of the California group, said his group did that and it is paying off. He was the main speaker at the 36th annual Oregon Coast Assn. banquet.

He said his own organization has two paid officials—one to be general manager and one to operate in the field. "They complement each other," he added.

Re-examine your goals and objectives and overall internal organizations; establish a program to meet these goals; and re-evaluate your entire finance program, he suggested.

The Californian, a supervisor in Del Norte County, hit the question of public vs. private money for tourist promotion.

Commissioners and supervisors should provide funds only to match money put up by those who will benefit most directly, he said.

"We're going to do that down in California, and I'm sure that it's going to be effective," Clauson said.

There is too much tendency, he asserted, for government to do all and free enterprise to do nothing.

Clauson also urged two budgets—one for public money and one for private money. There are things that governments can not spend money for, he said, and they should be in the private budget.

A luncheon audience Monday heard Earl C. Westwood, minister of recreation and conservation in British Columbia.
