Palm Sunday, April 10, will be observed with a series of outstanding services at Peace Memorial Presbyterian Church.

### Weekend Worship

"A special weekend of worship will be climaxed Sunday at 8 p.m. with the commemoration of the death of Jesus Christ by the Klamath Falls Congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses at their Kingdom Hall at 833 No. 9th Street."

George Hriciszewski, presiding minister, said.

When asked why Jehovah's Witnesses observe the memorial on April 10, the minister said, "Jesus died on Nisan 14, which falls on April 10 this year. According to the Lunar Calendar God gave to the Israelites, the year began in the spring with the new moon nearest the spring equinox; the equinox usually falling on March 21, the first day of spring. It must be remembered that Nisan 14 does not always fall on a Friday, but is the night of the first full moon after the spring equinox."

After a thorough scriptural discussion of Jesus Christ instituting the first "evening meal" and explaining the emblems of unleavened bread and red wine by associate minister, Fred Pearce, the emblems will be served to those worthy to partake. The public is cordially invited.

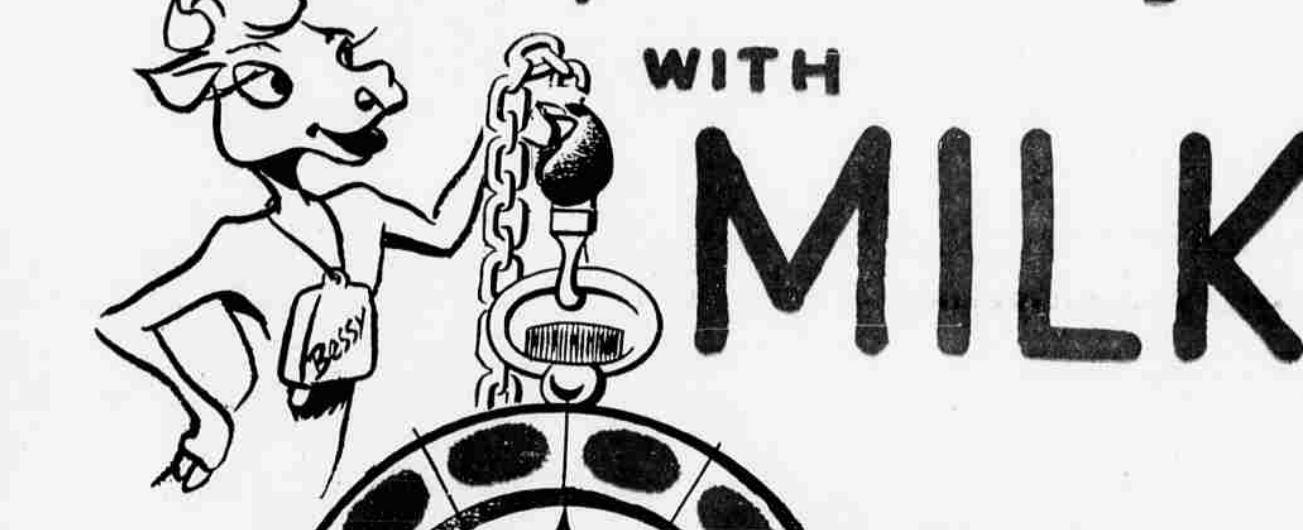
### Seven Last Words
