

### OTI Cinders Idle; Viks Next Test

The Oregon Tech track team which is idle this week is taking advantage of the dry climate, and is working out in preparation for its first Oregon Collegiate Conference meet with Portland State, the defending league champions, next April 17.

The dual meet is the Owls' second taste of competition this year and is the Vikings' third. OTI finished last in a three-way meet last Saturday with Nevada and Idaho State in a meet held at Reno. The Vikings initial meet is to be held tomorrow when they meet Linfield at McMinnville.

Last Saturday the Viks set the Willamette Relays distance medley record in the college division with a 10:44.8 time. The team has some real speedsters, but is definitely weak and vulnerable in some of its running events and in several field events.

The Techmen have two swiftness, L. T. Tennerson and Leon Wilson. Tennerson, who had only one day of practice before traveling with the team to Reno last week, led the century for 70 yards and then faded, finishing fifth in 19.4 flat. It was an extremely tight race with Nevada's Dick Strunk winning it in 10 flat although he has done 9.3 before.

Track coach Wally Palmberg has high hopes in several of his performers. Javelin thrower Howard Jackson achieved the best collegiate toss of his career in competition with a 179-foot toss which won the Reno event. This week Jackson has already exceeded that and may hit 185 feet against the Vikings. Dan Anderson reinforces the javelin ranks, and he is hitting 180 feet in practice this week.

Another corner who should improve is Harry Nelson in the pole vault. Nelson went out at 10 feet, six inches at Reno. However his best mark was accomplished in the state A-1 track meet when he vaulted 11-10.

Norman Johns should be hitting close to the 135-foot mark in the discus. At Reno he got off a 130-foot launch, but was disqualified when he stepped out of the ring. He had to settle with a 123-foot distance.

The greatest sore spot showing up in the Owl cinder team this year is the low hurdles event in which no Techmen is entered. However Palmberg has been trying Johns and several others in the 170 yarder.
