FHA Families Hold Meetings

The majority of families using Farmers Home Administration credit in Siskiyou and Modoc counties have completed a series of individual meetings with James F. Walker, the agency's county supervisor, to take a careful look at their 1959 operations and to make 1960 plans. The year-end analysis is a service extended to each family who finances through the agency and is designed to carefully analyze the previous year's business, and to plan the present year's program based on the facts learned from the analysis. The Farmers Home Administration Agency makes loans to eligible farmers to construct or improve essential farm buildings and to operate, improve or enlarge family-type farms. Walker advises that his office hours in the Tulelake area are from 1 to 5 p.m. on the second Monday of each month. He will be in the Tulelake Growers Office on the afternoon of April 11, 1960, and will welcome any inquiries regarding the agency's agricultural financing program.
