California Pheasant Policy Change Said To Be In Plans

SACRAMENTO (UPI)—The California Fish and Game Department is probably going to be forced to change its announced pheasant policy.

An official of the department admitted that the policy will be revised and liberalized in view of statements made at the most recent session of the Fish and Game Commission in Los Angeles. Some time ago, department chief Walter T. Shannon made known his views that the pheasant put-and-take program was on the way out.

He said at the time that the only pheasants that should be produced by the state should be turned over to private organizations for them to plant. He said only two hatcheries would be retained. The rest would be closed.

But this plan ran into trouble at the Los Angeles session—real trouble.

The reason given was that, according to Shannon, "not enough information was given out to either the Commission or the public."

He said that "as a result it has been found that there are a great many questions and quite a little controversy exists now in relation to the policy proposed." This is from the minutes of the F&G commission meeting.

At Shannon's suggestion, the whole matter was deferred again and he promised the department would "consider the proposed policy and perhaps modify it with a view toward increased efficiency and economy in pheasant production and eventual elimination of put-and-take pheasant shooting except, perhaps, in the southern part of the state.

"With the department's new cost accounting system in a few months it will be possible to tell just what the pheasants are costing the department and this would be most helpful in formulating policy," the minutes quote Shannon as saying.

Commissioner Carl Wentz told how the proposed policy would work.

Wentz said that:
1. Presently there are 13 cooperative hunting areas operating in the state of which there are none in the south.

2. There are two "so-called" co-ops in the south—at Etiwanda and Moreno.

3. There are seven hatcheries where the state produces pheas-

ants—at Chino, Imperial, Valley Center, San Diego, Yountville, Chico, Marysville and Sacramento.

4. If the policy were adopted there would be two hatcheries—one at Yountville and one at Chino, using prison labor to cut the overhead.

5. If the Imperial County plant were closed it would not necessarily mean that planting of birds in the area would be eliminated. The birds would be planted in that area from the Chino plant.

Wentz said that if the proposed policy were adopted there would be no planting of birds in "certain areas." He wanted the department to say just how that situation would be handled, how long it will be before the policy is fully activated and just what the end result would be.

Shannon agreed to draft a modified policy on pheasants but asked permission to wait until September or later when cost figures for a full year's operation would be available.

The cost figures would come from a cost accounting system required under a bill authored during the last session of the Legislature by Assemblywoman Pauline L. Davis (D-Portola), the woman chairman of the lower chamber's Fish and Game committee.

They are being used by the department to find just how much money is being spent on each program—pheasant, deer and others—so that the program can be geared to not spend more than it takes in.

This was one of the new policies announced by Shannon shortly after he took office as director of the department.
