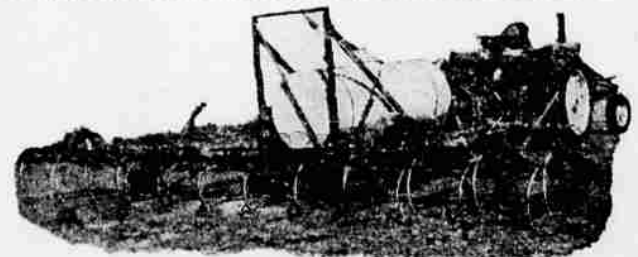
BLM Forester Wins Award
