Could She Continue?

Could she, in duty to her son, consort any further with this rebel lot? Could she place her son's life in jeopardy, along with her own?

The widow had come to love Jerusalem, with its aura of reverence and high principle, perhaps even more than those born and reared here, those who had never known directly the merciless cruelties of paganism that prevailed elsewhere.

Both she and her brother had grown up on the island of Cyprus, with its lavish Greek forums and theaters, its rare wines, its infanticide and self-mutilating frenzies of devotees to Adonis and Astarte.

School Aide, Five Nabbed For Payola

NEW YORK (AP)—An assistant grammar school principal and five other persons have been arrested on charges of selling 200,000 demerol papers to college students.

The four men and two women arrested Monday were arraigned in Special Sessions Court on charges of violating a provision of the state education law prohibiting fraud in obtaining diplomas and other certificates of learning.

Most of the 25 were students at Long Island and Elmhurst colleges in upstate New York.

Prices for the ghost-written papers went as high as \$2,000 for a dissertation aimed at a doctor's degree, said Det. Alby Frank Hogan.

Of 25 students who bought the papers—and later testified before a grand jury—nine were teachers trying for graduate degrees.

Hogan said some of those arrested also took examinations for students.
