Example Of Humility Set By Pope

ROME (UPI) — Pope John XXIII gives an example of Christian humility today by washing the feet of 13 priests representing races from the four corners of the world.

For the first time, Negro and Asiatic priests were included in the traditional Holy Thursday ceremony in the Pope's own basilica, St. John's in Lateran.

The Pope's choice of African priests at a time of racial strife in South Africa and the United States appeared to be a protest against intolerance, which the Pontiff often has condemned in sermons. It followed his naming of the first Negro, Filipino, and Japanese cardinals in modern Roman Catholic history.

The pre-Easter ceremony is as old as Christianity itself. The rite commemorates Christ's own act of humility in washing the feet of 12 disciples on the eve of his crucifixion.

Popes have performed the ceremony through the centuries with 13 men taking part, although there were only 12 apostles of Christ.

The extra man was added by a 6th Century pope, St. Gregory the Great, who discovered a 13th pair of feet among those he was washing.

He washed them without question, and, according to church tradition, learned in a vision that they were the feet of Christ himself.

The Holy Thursday ceremonies started a busy period of Easter commemoration in Rome and the Vatican.

The Pope will deliver his Easter message, one of the most important of the church year, in a radio and television broadcast on Sunday. The Vatican radio will broadcast the message around the world in many languages. Radio Free Europe will relay it behind the Iron Curtain.

Lads' Visit Try Foiled

MOUNT CLEMENS, Mich. (AP) — Robert R. Prescott and Edwin Sutherland, both 19, went to the Macomb County jail to visit a friend. Howard Haskin, 18, charged with breaking and entering.

Zip The Lip, Passengers Informed

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — "Zip charge was the fifth such arrest in eight days."

That wartime security slogan looks more and more like good advice to airline travelers who get an impulse to crack a "joke" about a bomb.

The FBI's arrest here Wednesday night of Julius Roudolph Radwanski, 36, Huntingdon Valley, Pa., on a false bomb report

fore U.S. Commissioner Robert W. Newton for a hearing.

Radwanski was released on a \$1,000 bond, reported E. D. Ma by a Trans World Airlines employee at Port Columbus Airport at Cincinnati who related the incident. Radwanski, a sales engineer in a Philadelphia construction firm, is to appear in U.S. District Court next Wednesday.

TWA flight 300 from Columbus to Pittsburgh was delayed 32 minutes while officials searched for the bomb. None was found.

Earlier Wednesday in San Francisco a neon tube bender was charged with the same offense. The U.S. attorney's office filed the charge against William A. Grant of Belmont, Calif.

A United Air Lines spokesman said Grant was trying to take out insurance on his wife after seeing her aboard a Los Angeles-bound DC8 jet when he made his remark. Told Mrs. Grant would prosecute such cases, with U.S. attorneys requesting jail sentences for persons convicted.

Other arrests in recent days were made at Tulsa, Okla., Sarasota, Fla. and Indianapolis, Ind. All involved traveling business executives alleged to have made remarks about a bomb.

A false bomb report carries a maximum penalty of a \$1,000 fine and or one year in prison, in the British Isles, is equal to 14 pounds.

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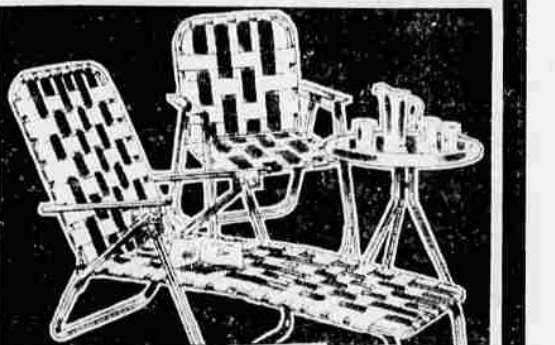
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
