### Henley To Present Concert

"Melodies in Spring" will be presented by the Henley High School music department Friday evening in the gymnasium beginning at 8 o'clock.

That is the annual spring band and chorus concert. Proceeds will be used in the music department. Tickets are available from department students or at the box office.

The program is arranged this way. The band will play "Colonel Bogey," a lively concert-style march by Kenneth J. Alford, and "The Phantom Regiment," by Leroy Anderson. "O'er the Billoey Sea" will be sung by soloist Phil Jameson. Chuck Blotzky will play a saxophone solo, "Buckled in the Cradle of the Deep," by E. DeLamater.

Again, the band will offer "The Waltz King," a medley of Strauss waltzes, including "Tales of the Vienna Woods," "The Hat Polka," "Southern Breeze," "The Barletta March," "Carnival in Rome," and "The Blue Danube," arranged by Herman A. Hammer. Sandy Short will follow with a vocal solo, "I Believe."

The mixed chorus will sing "Aurora Lee," a lifting tune by R. J. Hughes and "Little Boy Blue" written by Ethelbert Nevia. Virginia Fuller, chorus vice president, will direct the group. The chorus will follow that selection with "Tumbling Tumbleweed," a sad cowboy song that has gained general popularity, written by Bob Nolan.

During the intermission Marilyn Mack will entertain. Afterward, the intermediate band directed by Barbara Medley will play "Wagon Wheels" by Peter DeRose, "Were You There?" a spiritual by Noble Cain, and "Go Down, Moses" by James Allen Dush. "Lady of Spain," an accordion solo by Bill Seides, will follow.

The senior band will return with "A Mozart Festival" by Claire W. Johnson, "Clarinet Escapade" by Russel Ward, featuring the clarinet section and "Laureate" by J. Olivadoti, to be directed by Bert Albratton, band president.

The chorus will close with "The Lord's Prayer" by Albert Hay Malotte, arranged by Carl Deas.

The concert band is composed of four flutes, 12 clarinets, eight trumpets, eight trombones, four saxophones, two basses, a french horn, a baritone horn, and six drums.

### 19 Votes Go To Kennedy

CHICAGO (AP)—Sen. John F. Kennedy (D-Mass.) received 19 write-in votes for president to 11 for Adlai E. Stevenson in Tuesday's state primary in Stevenson's home precinct in suburban Mettawa, in Lake County.

Stevenson, twice-defeated Democratic presidential nominee, is a Mettawa village trustee.

The write-in vote for president in 110 other precincts of the 100 in Lake County showed 1,395 for Kennedy; 761 for Stevenson; 135 for Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey (D-Minn.); 33 for Sen. Stuart Symington (D-Mo.); 15 for Sen. Lyndon B. Johnson (D-Tex.).

Kennedy's brother, Robert, a former Senate committee counsel, got 20 votes, one more than given Chester Bowles, former governor of Connecticut.

### Pressure Placed On Nixon To Open Political Drive

WASHINGTON (AP)—New pressure built up on Vice President Richard M. Nixon today to open up with political campaigning before the Republican presidential nominating convention.

Sen. Barry Goldwater of Arizona, chairman of the Republican Senatorial Campaign Committee, said Nixon's showing in Tuesday's Illinois primary conceivably may bring some changes in the vice president's strategy.

Ripping unopposed in the GOP presidential primary, Nixon collected 725,000 votes with nearly 500 precincts unreported. This approached but still fell below the 721,210 President Eisenhower got in the 1956 primary.

### 6-Car Accident; Only One Hurt

NAMPA, Idaho (AP)—James Agnew, 73, tried to pass another car which was making a left turn.

His car struck the fender of the other vehicle, sideswiped a third car, bounced off a pickup truck, ran through a hedge, over a small irrigation ditch and ran into a parked car shoving it into another one.

"I was afraid if I kept hitting things, I'd get hurt," said Agnew.

Only one person was hurt—slightly—in the six-car accident on U.S. Highway 59.

Possibly more significant, however, the vice president fell more than 150,000 votes short of the total rolled up by Sen. Paul Douglas, a Democratic liberal who was unopposed for renomination to the Senate.

Goldwater said this outcome could be discounted somewhat because Douglas had done what he called a good job of campaigning and no special Republican drive was put on for Nixon.

"But it suggests that maybe the vice president ought to take another look at his determination not to campaign until after the convention," Goldwater said.

Nixon's lieutenants don't agree with this assessment, of course. They have plenty of precedent for their view that his candidate runs in an unopposed primary has little to do with his final showing in November.

Nevertheless, they could be disturbed by the failure of nearly 100,000 Republicans who voted in the Illinois GOP governor's race to take the trouble to cast a ballot for Nixon, even though he was unopposed.

They obviously recognize this, and Nixon's failure to keep pace with potential Democratic presidential rivals in Wisconsin, as encouraging to those Republicans who still hope to draft Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller of New York for the nomination.
