

Budget Hike For Oregon Requested

WASHINGTON (AP) — Congress was asked Wednesday to increase by \$1,037,400 the budget recommendation for Oregon navigation projects.

The request to House and Senate appropriation subcommittees was made by Thomas J. Murray, an Oregon port consultant, on behalf of Gov. Mark Hatfield.

President Eisenhower's budget contained \$2,292,200 for Oregon navigation projects in the year that will begin July 1.

Army Engineers have indicated they could use the additional money, Murray said.

Murray said the state supports these budget requests:

Columbia River, south jetty, rehabilitation and construction, \$1,000,000; Columbia River, south jetty planning, \$50,000; Columbia River study, \$31,900; Yaquina Bay study, \$300,000; Siuslaw River jetty planning, \$5,000; Umpqua River study, \$11,300; Coos-Millicoma River planning, \$23,000; Coos Bay planning, \$50,000; Rogue River new construction, \$1,792,000.

He asked these additional amounts:

Columbia River south jetty rehabilitation and construction, \$460,000; Columbia River-Megler study, \$5,000; Tillamook Bay and Bar study, \$10,000; Siuslaw River south jetty construction, \$170,000; Siuslaw River study, \$10,000; Umpqua River jetty planning, \$30,000; Umpqua River south jetty construction, \$160,000; Coos Bay study, \$6,000; Coquille River study, \$3,400; Port Orford study, \$9,000; Rogue River study, \$3,000; Chetco River study, \$6,000.

Request Withdrawn

PORTLAND (AP) — City Manager Andrew J. Browning Wednesday withdrew his request that Ernest Gallaher resign as police chief within 30 days.

Browning said the chief had been asked to quit "because he lacked leadership qualities." But he added, he believes differences can be worked out.

The City Council voted 6-2 Wednesday to retain Gallaher, 36, who has been Portland's police chief since 1956.

The council decided to establish an inquiry board to hear complaints against the police department.
