Sugar Hart Earns TKO

CHICAGO (AP) — Rocky Kalingo, the Philippine welterweight champion, is going back to Los Angeles where it's warm after being cooled off in Chicago in more ways than one.

Sugar Hart of Philadelphia, seventh rated contender, scored a fifth round technical knockout over Rocky Wednesday night, spoiling his scheduled 10-round national television debut in Chicago Stadium. Hart weighed 152, Kalingo 145.

Kalingo, a 5-2 underdog, was knocked by a right-left combination near the end of the fourth round. He sagged to his knees and the count reached seven before the bell ended the round.

Dr. Irving Slatoff of the Illinois Athletic Commission examined the 24-year-old Kalingo between rounds and ruled he was in no condition to continue. He was dazed, and a cut in ear tissue over his left eye was bleeding freely.

"During most of my training in Chicago, the weather was cold and I'm not used to it," said Kalingo. "I caught a cold in my head and I always felt tired. By the third round, I could hardly get my arms up. When I moved in to punch, I couldn't draw back. That's when Hart connected."

"I want to go back to California where it's warm. I would like to fight Hart again there, or in Hawaii."

Baseball Boss Notes Plan

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Baseball Commissioner Ford C. Frick has proposed alternative means by which the Western Carolina League could operate in conjunction with the Continental League without violating the Major-Minor Leagues agreement.

In a letter to Sen. Estes Kefauver (D-Tenn.), chairman of the Senate Anti-Monopoly Subcommittee, Frick said he did not refuse to sanction operations of the proposed Western Carolina League.

The commissioner said he objected only to a proposed agreement whereby the Continental League would have supplied all players for the Western Carolina League and would have, in effect, operated the minor circuit. Such an agreement, Frick said, would violate baseball law.

Frick suggested that the two proposed leagues set up a system under which the eight Continental League teams would each own or control one Carolina affiliate and thus avoid pooling of players and control of one league by another.

SHREWSBURY, England (UPI) — Stirling Moss, one of the world's leading race drivers, today was searching for a chauffeur to drive him around England.

The British speed demon was round guilty of dangerous driving Wednesday and will have to confine his driving to closed circuits for one year. He also was fined 50 pounds (\$140).

Although his lawyer told the court the conviction was a "great blow," Moss said he would not appeal.

"I shall now have to have someone drive me around England," Moss added, "I drive about 30,000 miles a year on the road — about 20,000 of which are in this country."

It is the first league tilt for the Tech name, and the team may be lacking power at several positions on account of two players having scholastic ineligibility.

Another member of the team who will be missed is Stan Glass, one of the best stickmen on the team last year.

Owl coach Jim Cordial said he plans to play Hank Richardson in Hamilton's position at third base. Richardson is a good glove man but is weak at the plate.

Glass, who has not yet played for the Tech nine this year, carries a potent bat, but Cordial said either Rollin Swanson or Lee Simmons will hold down center field when they are not on the mound.

Swanson and Simmons are the club's top two hurlers. Swanson pitched effective ball on the California trip last week on occasion. Perhaps, Cordial said, he will come around.

Cordial spoke highly of chucker Lee Simmons who pitched three hit ball until he pulled a muscle in the fifth inning of the McClellan game which the Owls eventually lost 6-1.
