Oretech Nine Seeking Initial Victory

Oregon Collegiate Conference Oregon Tech Owl baseball team, still looking for win number one after eight starts in the current ball season, had a heart-to-heart talk with themselves Wednesday.

Coach Jim Cordial and his decided that this was the

weekend that they would finally crack the win column.

They have their work cut out for them.

Friday afternoon in Monmouth the Owls take the diamond for the first of a three-game Oregon Collegiate Conference series with the Oregon College Wolves. Saturday afternoon the two clubs square off in a doubleheader that wraps it up.

The Wolves, led by coach Bob Livingston, have a two-game edge over the rest of the OCC clubs and are sporting a 3-2 win-loss mark for league play. In their last outing the OCE nine whipped the Southern Oregon College Red Raiders 6-3 and 5-3. Friday, however, the Raiders came out on top 8-4. The Wolves are currently number two on the league ladder behind unbeaten Eastern Oregon.

The OEC opened against the Owls in La Grande last weekend and won all three tests. The scores were 10-3, 7-1 and 7-2.

Cordial, in his first year as boss of the OTI diamond fortunes, said, "We don't look good. Sure, the weather has been against us but that isn't a good enough reason. It hurts to lose—and it hurts worse when you look bad losing. We aren't discouraged, yet, though, I think we'll come around."

Picked by the Owl mentor for the starting pitching assignments against the Wolves are Lee Simmons, Roland Swanson and Max McKibbin, who between them have been charged with seven of the eight Owl losses. Gary Voget had to take the rap on the other.

Going into the weekend action, third - sacker Ardell Hamilton leads the OTI stickers. Hamilton boasts a .500 average and shares the top spot in runs scored with catcher Charlie Wilson. Both have tallied five times.

Top RBI honors, however, belong to shortstop Dick Olivias who has chased six runners home despite a .200 batting average.

Only six of the Tech hitters have managed to crack the 200 mark thus far. In addition to Hamilton and Olivias, they are outfielder Wayne Morrow (.259), McKibbin (.250), outfielder Stan Glass (.265) and relief catcher John Wise (.333). As a unit the

Owls can claim only a .191 hitting average.

Pat McLaughlin relieved Quinney in the sixth and gave up no hits, walks or runs. Jerry Anderson finished the game for Medford and allowed two runs on one hit and three walks.

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
