

ANGLING REPORT Medford Battlers To Show Owl Athletes Face Rough Competition

Oregon anglers are keeping an eye on the sky as the Saturday opening date draws near — but chances are when the day dawns they will have completely ignored the weather and will be all set at their favorite spot, provided, of course, they can get to it.

Lake of the Woods was still frozen over as of Tuesday and it is questionable whether it will be open by Saturday. Road into Lee Thomas Meadows on the Upper Sprague River (north fork) is blocked by snow. Klamath River and Klamath Lake are excellent.

Road is open into Odell Lake resort, where there are some parking and boat launching facilities. Campgrounds have at least 8 to 10 inches of snow and provide limited space at best. The road into Lake of the Woods is open one-way traffic in spots. Although the campgrounds are bare in places, there is snow up to two to three feet deep in some places.

Deschutes River from Wickiup to mouth of Little Deschutes will be lower than normally encountered on opening weekend. Campgrounds and roads paralleling the river on both east and west shores are in good condition. Angling should be good for single egg and worm anglers as well as the troll fishermen. Deschutes River from Little Deschutes to Bend is in good condition.

Roads and campgrounds in the area are all open. Anglers should experience good catches on troll with spinner and worms as well as fishing from shore with lures and bait. Deschutes River from Bend downstream to mouth of Crooked River is as low as summer flow and in good condition.

Fly fishermen in this area are expected to record good catches. Bait fishermen and lure fishermen should also score well. Deschutes River below Pelton Dam and in the Warm Springs area should provide excellent catches of rainbow trout on bait. Crooked River at Cove State Park is last season.

The number of boats on the Owl boat-order of 0 amateur fight card scheduled in the Klamath Falls Auditorium Saturday night at 8 o'clock climbed past the 10 mark Wednesday afternoon with the announcement by co-mancher Lou Jones of Chiloquin that he had secured five top Medford battlers to appear in the big show.

Ingo, Floyd Finally Sign

NEW YORK (AP) — Ingemar Johansson signed a contract today to defend his world heavyweight boxing title against Floyd Patterson, the man he dethroned in the Polo Grounds on Monday, June 20. The pact was the result of almost 10 months of negotiations.

The contract, signed in the offices of the New York State Athletic Commission, gives each boxer 25 per cent of the gate receipts. The boxers get 70 per cent of the money taken in for TV, radio and film rights.

The pact also calls for a return bout in 90 days if Patterson wins. Teltrap/Ter was the successful bidder for the closed TV rights, paying \$450,000 for them.

Johansson was to leave later today for Switzerland, where he will resume his preliminary training. He will return to Grossinger, N.Y., where he prepared for the 1959 bout, on May 3.
