Broncs, Braves Meet At Gem Field

Klamath Union High School coach Bob Williams gets a chance to renew some old acquaintanceships and Klamath Falls baseball fans get one of their few chances

to see professional baseball locally when the Lewiston Broncs and the Tri-City Braves, both of the Northwest League, play in Gem Stadium tomorrow night at 7 o'clock. Stadium gates and box office will open at 6 o'clock.

Williams, an ex-Northwest League player, arranged for the game in KF through the cooperation of Lewiston manager John McNamara and Brave boss Whitey McDowell.

Both ball teams feature big league farm hands and each have affiliations with major league clubs. The Lewiston crew is in its first year in a limited working agreement with the Kansas City Athletics. Tri-City announced a hookup with the Baltimore Orioles Wednesday. This is also a limited agreement according to club officials.

Wednesday afternoon in Rio Vista, where the clubs have been holding spring training, the Tri-City nine walloped the Broncs, 13-11. Gray won 10 and lost 18 for the Broncs last season while Johnson boasted a 13-11 mark for the Tri-City nine. His 2.39 ERA was third best among the league hurlers, since the Broncs had taken last season.

A couple of O'Conner brothers—Jim and Al—ran all over the Klamath Union junior varsity and Chiloquin in a three way meet held at Modoc Field Tuesday to lead their Bonanza teammates to a 67-52-19 victory.

Between them the O'Conners took a total of five first places, in the 100, 220, 120 low hurdles, 300 and the 400. Teammates Henry Dearborne, Denny Ellis and Jim Brooks picked up the other three first place victories for the Antlers in the mile, shot put and javelin.

Chiloquin's Lyle Hall collected his club's only first with a 122-foot toss in the javelin.

The tremendous depth of the Klamath junior varsity team contributed the majority of the club's 52 points. Dale Stiles, Dana Ash and Sherd Duncan gathered firsts in the 70 yard high hurdles, the high jump and the broad jump. Klamath won the relay in 1:41.0 minutes.
