MOSCOW (UPI) — The opening of "My Fair Lady" in Moscow certainly was one of the most thrilling of my career.

The cast was a little nervous after the reserved reception the diplomatic corps gave to a special performance the night before.

But when the final curtain rang down opening night the Russian audience rushed to the orchestra pit applauding, shouting "bravo" and demanding more curtain calls.

We applauded back in the Russian tradition and then went backstage for a champagne party with the Russian crew who worked very hard alongside our American stage hands.

Robert Coates, who plays Col. Pickering, led a series of toasts with the first strains of "For He's A Jolly Good Fellow" and "Hip-hip-hurrah."

Afterward, the cast went back to the Ukraine Hotel for another celebration given by the Russian theatrical officials.

I was served caviar, smoked salmon, chicken and ice cream and drank 150 proof vodka.

When the officials of "Gosconcert" — the Soviet organization sponsoring the show—made laudatory speeches, it really touched the cast.

To repeat the old expression, there wasn't a dry eye in the house.
