Fullmer Still Champ

BOZEMAN, Mont. (AP)—Champion Gene Fullmer's NBA middleweight crown still rested on his scared and bruised brow today after tilting dangerously in a slugging and butting duel with challenger Joey Giardello.

The officials ruled the wild, 15-round brawl Wednesday night a draw.

Giardello, a 3-to-1 underdog, chanted afterward "I'm the champion, I'm the champion!"

Fullmer ignored Joey's claim and said he'd never again fight the Philadelphia veteran who missed by a hair's breadth in his first title shot after 12 years in the ring.

"He doesn't deserve a rematch because of the way he butted me in the fourth round," Fullmer said. His manager, Marv Jensen, said the champion's decision has to be a draw, Fullmer said. "Sure, I butted him," Giardello retorts his crown."

Beanballs Fly Early

Yup, and it seems only natural that the two teams firing at each other are the Giants and Dodgers to establish who's the boss.

The Giants were Wednesday when southpaw Mike McCormick not only pitched them to a two-hit, 1-0 victory over the Dodgers, but also had the last word in a lively dusting duel with side-armed Don Drysdale.

Drysdale, who allowed only five hits in dropping his first game of the season following two victories, hit Orlando Cepeda on the head with a pitch in the second inning Cepeda's helmet saved him on that one. Then in the sixth, Drysdale stung Willie Mays with a fast ball on the left forearm. Mays grimaced in pain but trotted down to first base.

Now it was McCormick's turn in the top of the seventh. He didn't waste any time firing his first pitch straight at Wally Moon's head. Moon hit the dirt as the ball whizzed past him and that ended the beanballs—for the day anyway.

The victory was McCormick's second, coming after a three-hit 6-1 win over the Cardinals on April 13, and he even helped his own cause at the plate. Willie Kirkland led off the fifth with a single and moved up on an infield out. With two down, McCormick caught Dodger third baseman Jim Gilliam flat-footed as he laid down a perfect bunt along the foul line. That sent Kirkland to third from where he scored on Don Blasingame's single.

The victory boosted the Giants into a first-place tie with the Dodgers.

Pittsburgh defeated Philadelphia, 4-2, and Cincinnati beat Milwaukee, 10-5, in 10 innings. Chicago and St. Louis were idle.

In the American League, the Tigers topped the Indians for the second straight time, 6-4, the Red Sox walloped the Yankees, 7-1, and the Senators beat the Orioles, 6-7. The White Sox and A's were not scheduled.

Don Hoak's two-run homer in the fifth inning was the Pirates' margin of victory over the Phillies. Vern Law scattered seven hits for his second victory and when the Phillies finally scored in the seventh, it marked the first run Law had yielded this season in 15 consecutive innings. Don Cardwell was the loser.

The Malin squad made the most of an overthrow on a double play, a leaky stop at the plate of a long throw from the outfield, and three walks in collecting their two runs in the bottom of the first.

Bob Brown, Don Johnson and Jim Long supplied the only three Malin safe hits, all singles.

Hornets Set For Journey

The Henley Hornet cindermen travel to Burns this Saturday for a three-way meet with Burns and Sherman High School of Oregon.

The Hornets had their first taste of competition last weekend in the fifth annual Lakeview invitational relays in which they placed third behind Bend and Lakeview. Burns scored eight points in the meet to finish seventh.

Hornet coach Fred Hess said he "feels quite confident" that his track squad will fare quite well at the Burns meet.

Hess has good reason to be optimistic. Letterman Dave Ragland and transfer Wes Johnson from Highlands High School in Sacramento both placed firsts at the Lakeview invitational. Ragland ran a 16.6 seconds high hurdles, and Johnson set the invitational meet mark in the 800 with a 2:03.4 quarter mile.

However the Hornets' most versatile athlete, Bob Chapman, was unable to make the Lakeview trip. Hess said that Chapman should be ready for the Burns-Sherman meet after recovering from a pulled muscle. Chapman competes in the high and low hurdles and the pole vault.
