

### Wilder Back On Group For American Indian Days

Lefty Wildeagle Wilder, Chilochin, has been re-elected a member of the Indian Executive Committee of the All American Indian Days, to be held again this year in Sheridan, Wyoming. Dates for the event have been set for August 5, 6, 7.

Wilder will furnish information on all phases of the big show. "The Pageant of the Plains," including sports, contests, the Indian Olympics, the contest for Miss Indian American, the arts and crafts exposition and other facts.

All American Indian Days are expected to draw over 40 tribes of American Indians from 20 states, more than 3,000 redmen, whose ancestors in the olden days killed buffalo, were fierce warriors of the plains and fought wars.

They will gather on historic ground to voluntarily contribute to what has been called "the greatest interracial, cooperative effort in human relations of this century."

Again this year they will come to engage in friendly competition, and to exemplify age old ceremonies, sports and rites, real and authentic, interspersed by acts performed by talented young Indians, to illustrate the progress they have made from the old to the new, and to build a better understanding between the red and white races. The annual outstanding Indian of the year award will be made and a new queen will be chosen to rule over her people.

Both will be graduated from Klamath Union High School in June.

### Okay Needed For X-ray

Minors must have written permission from parents, a doctor, or the Klamath County Health Department to be X-rayed by the mobile chest X-ray unit that will be in the county for two months beginning Wednesday.

Dr. S. M. Kerron, county health officer, said the unit must abide by a state ruling. The health department or a doctor may order an X-ray if a TB skin test is positive or if a person has been exposed to the disease.
