Out-of-town bidder interest in construction of the Lucile O'Neill Elementary School at Eberlein and Avalon streets is being shown, according to Morrison, Howard & Starbuck, 205-05 Williams Bldg., architects . . . among the first general contractors to take out plans and specifications (bid opening is 7:30 p.m., May 16) were Cummings Construction Co., Grants Pass, and Vik Construction Co., Eugene.

At the State Highway Department bid opening on Tuesday, apparent low bidder for a contract to pave 8.15 miles of Diamond Lake Junction-Lenz Road section of The Dalles-California Highway, 32 miles north of Klamath Falls, was the Rogue River Paving Co., Medford, which entered a bid of \$108,747.
