Lumber Gives Personality To An Up-To-Date Kitchen

We all would like our kitchens to have the same modern conveniences as our neighbors' but most of us would prefer to add our own individual touches of distinction when it comes to style. Functionality is very important, but so is the warmth that adds to the whole family's enjoyment.

One of the most attractive ways to be up-to-the-minute in kitchen planning is with lumber and lumber paneling, which makes beautiful and easily cared for built-ins and wall covering. Such built-ins can enclose or even hide your big kitchen appliances, and they also will make excellent storage cupboards and cabinets above and below your counter areas. Beyond this, lumber is excellent for closets, valances, shelving and other useful and decorative adjuncts to sound kitchen planning and pleasant atmosphere.

An excellent choice of softwoods for this sort of job are the 10 kinds that grow in the Western pine region. They are economical, easy to work with and they also respond beautifully to whatever stain or finishing treatment you may prefer. If you plan to use a clear finish you can choose your wood from among the dark reddish-toned species, such as inland red cedar and incense cedar, or you might like one of the very light woods such as Idaho white pine, Engelmann spruce, or ponderosa pine. Other good choices from the Western pine region are larch, lodgepole pine, sugar pine, white fir and Douglas fir.

Storage is a primary consideration in kitchen planning. You should design your cabinets and cupboards so that things are within easy reach of various work areas. For example, heavy pots and pans should be kept where you can reach them easily, spices and herbs are better kept near the stove (but not in line with its drying heat), laundry supplies should be stored near your washer. Small appliances such as mixers and blenders can be left out on counter tops if you use them often, but if you like the completely "put away" look plan space for them in a cupboard close to the area where you use them most.

An attractive eating area is very important to your kitchen, too. This may take the form of a dining corner or table nook, or the Western Pine Association suggests that you might like the idea of building a breakfast or snack bar. Any of these arrangements can utilize lumber or paneling that matches your other built-ins. A breakfast counter will give you even more storage space since you can put cabinets below, but be sure to recess them some so that there will be sufficient knee room when your family sits down to eat.

Electrical outlets are very important in remodeling or building a kitchen. Put in some convenient base plugs but also install counter-high outlets about every four running feet. See to it that your overhead lighting is good too.
