

'Copter Used By Governor

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. (UPI)—Whistle-blowing has been given new meaning and flavor in Illinois where a Republican governor is fighting with a helicopter campaign for his political life.

The 'copter campaign mirrors what candidates on both sides have said since the start of the vote-getting treks — the Illinois campaign would be one of the most intensive in the state's history.

It's been a rough campaign and about the only thing the Republicans and Democrats agree on is that the races in the state will be tight.

Voter reaction has ranged from enthusiastic to desultory, depending on the area. Visits by Vice President Richard M. Nixon and Henry Cabot Lodge seemed to give the Republicans the early advantage in the whoop-la department. However, Sen. John F. Kennedy campaigned down state last week, following up Lyndon B. Johnson.

The top of the Republican ticket will be hard to beat in Illinois which is traditionally Republican. The Republicans will have a tougher time in the state races. The man getting the most attention in Illinois politics isn't even on the ticket. He is Richard J. Daley, mayor of Chicago, who, as chairman of the Cook County Central Committee, is the state's leading Democrat.

GOP Hits Daley
Republicans have accused him of handicapping the Democratic candidates and of trying to control the whole state from Chicago's City Hall.

Politicians sometimes consider Illinois as three vote areas: 1) Chicago; 2) southern Illinois; 3) the rest of it.

The Democrats are strong in Chicago. Downstate the Republicans have the power. The big question is can the Democrats turn out enough Chicago votes to offset a likely Republican majority in the other 101 counties?

Both parties are counting heavily on the presidential candidates to help the state tickets. There has been no indication that either Kennedy or Nixon will get themselves personally embroiled in the campaign of bitterness now underway.

Never too happy with each other, Chicago and downstate are feuding with muddy brushes.

The Republican campaign is pegged to the charge that victory by Democrats in Illinois would bring the "sins" of Chicago to the statehouse in Springfield. Chicago is a city of corruption, they say.

and Democrats run it. More specifically, Daley runs it and he runs the candidate for governor, according to Republicans.

The Republican warning to the small towns and rural areas decries crime syndicates, the Chicago police scandal and unsolved murders. At the front of the Republican brigade is Gov. William G. Stratton, Daley's arch foe.

Stratton Uses Helicopter
A helicopter serves as Stratton's campaign transportation. He made 20 stops during his first day in the whirlwind. It sets down near shopping centers, subdivisions, farms and the like.

The helicopter hasn't escaped the barbs of the opposition. Otto Kerner, Stratton's opponent, says the governor took to the air because the highways were so bad. The Illinois road system is considered by Stratton a major administration accomplishment.

Kerner, a former U.S. attorney and Cook County Judge, has called Stratton a political boss with his back to the wall. Stratton's shouts about Chicago constitute reaching for straws, Kerner says.

The Democrats often remind the voters that Stratton's former administrative aide, on the eve of the campaign, was fined and sentenced for income tax evasion.

And the Democrats haven't forgotten the 1956 Orville Enoch Hodge scandal. He was once state auditor and now is behind bars. He looted the treasury of a million dollars during Stratton's administration.

Hatred Was Reason For Terror

LOS ANGELES (UPI)—"I hate people."

These three words spoken by the illiterate father of six appeared today to be the main explanation for a reign of terror in which motorists of four states were plundered in the manner of executed "red light bandit" Gary Chessman.

Barrel-chested Elton H. Hale, 42, ex-convict, hog rancher and father of six has confessed to leading a band of highwaymen who robbed motorists in California, Arizona, Texas and Arkansas. Some of their victims were left bruised and bleeding, others were chained and several women—including a 12-year-old girl—were raped, police said.

"I've never done anything right—it's always been wrong," Hale told officers after he was captured Friday when he failed to dim his auto's headlights for an approaching California Highway Patrol car.

"I know I'm going to get a lot of time for this. You've probably got enough on me that I'll never get out of jail," Hale said. Officers believe they do have a lot on Hale and on three accomplices whom he named. Two of them, E.J. Minor, 31, and Leroy Coates, 27, were arrested in Yuma, Ariz., shortly after Hale confessed.

Hale's brother, Jord, 27, was arrested by Merced County Sheriff John LaTorraca near Livermore, Calif., where the elder Hale had a hog ranch which he left in May, telling his family he was going "to pick cotton." LaTorraca booked the brother into Merced jail shortly before midnight on charges of kidnap, armed robbery and sex perversion.

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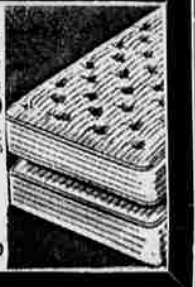
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Fliers' Trial Delay Hinted

LONDON (UPI)—Diplomatic reports indicated today there would be another delay in the Soviet trial of the two surviving crewmen of the American RB47 reconnaissance plane shot down by Russian fighter planes last July 1.

Soviet authorities were reported experiencing difficulties in preparing the case, specifically in trying to obtain a confession from the two Americans who were taken prisoner after the plane was shot down over the Barents Sea. Complete official silence was being maintained by Russian officials and latest diplomatic reports gave credence to rumors that the Kremlin was marking time.

U. S. Ambassador Llewellyn Thompson recently talked with Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev about the case and although nothing was officially disclosed about their talks, indications were that Moscow was not prepared to release the two fliers.

The United States claimed that the plane was over international

waters when it was shot down. The Soviets claimed it was in their territorial waters.

Britain firmly backed the U.S. position. The plane had taken off from Brize Norton Air Base in England and was reported flying a weather mission to gain information on electro-magnetic phenomena at the time.

The Soviets apparently have found the RB47 incident a harder nut to crack than the case of U2 flier Francis Gary Powers who was convicted of aerial espionage in a show trial last month. His plane was downed over Sverdlovsk, Siberia, May 1, and the incident used by Khrushchev as an excuse to wreck the Paris summit conference.

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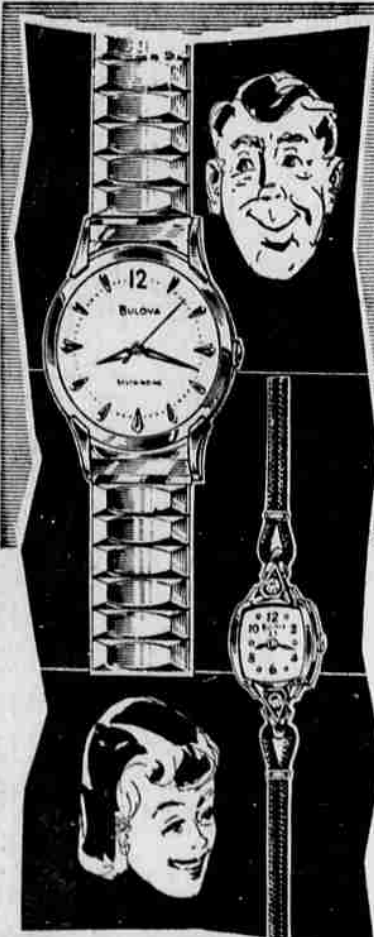
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
