

War II Vets Training Brought Back To Life

A training program for disabled World War II veterans that ended in July has been brought back to life for another five years.

Candidate Hits Charge

SEATTLE (AP) — Henry Cabot Lodge denied Friday night that he ever said the United States was in a weak legal position in the U2 case.

The Republican vice presidential candidate commented on the second televised debate between Sen. John F. Kennedy and Vice President Richard M. Nixon.

He said Kennedy, the Democratic presidential nominee, "totally misstated my position on the U2 case when he stated that I said our legal position was weak."

"I never said any such thing," the former United States ambassador to the United Nations declared.

What Kennedy said was: "Mr. Lodge, on 'Meet the Press' a month ago, said if there was ever a case when we did not have law on our side it was in the U2 incident."

The Lodge statement which he was citing occurred in a Sept. 18 TV interview (NBC-Meet the Press).

Asked whether this country now has as much influence, relative to the Soviet Union, as it had eight years ago, Lodge answered: "In return let me just point to the U2 case. Now you might say that if ever there was a case where we didn't have the law on our side, it was the U2 case."

"And yet when the Soviet Union proceeded against us in the security council on the U2 case, they got the most dreadful defeat. Now does that show that the Soviet Union has got more prestige than we have, when they had a case where you might say that they had us in the wrong?"

Winding up a 22-hour Western Washington visit before pushing on to California Saturday, Lodge also criticized Kennedy's comments regarding the islands of Quemoy and Matsu off the Chinese mainland.

"When he recommended drawing a line which would put Quemoy and Matsu on the Communist side, he was making a great tactical error," Lodge said. "It is good tactics to keep them (the Chinese Communists) in doubt."

At an earlier news conference, Lodge said United Nations Negro leader Ralph Bunche would make an excellent ambassador to the Soviet Union. He urged greater use of Negro diplomats in overseas posts.

"It would present the best possible evidence that the United States does not merely give lip service to the ideals of freedom and opportunity in the Declaration of Independence or the Constitution," he said.

"This could not be more important in a world in which four-fifths of the people are not of the white race."

He has not discussed his suggestion about Bunche with his presidential running mate, he said. Bunche, a former assistant secretary to the U.S. United Nations delegation, was recently placed in temporary charge of the new United Nations force of African troops in the Congo.

Lodge was to leave for San Francisco Saturday forenoon and remain in the Bay Area until flying back to New York late Tuesday.

Some 1,000 veterans—most with serious disabilities—stand to benefit.

They were undergoing training when the program, Public Law 16, came to an end on July 25. A new law permits virtually all of them (those who were in training on June 1) to resume their courses at government expense.

Also, the law establishes a new deadline of July 25, 1965.

The Veterans Administration explained that the vocational training program for most disabled World War II veterans ended four years ago. But a special four-year extension was granted in certain exceptional cases—mainly veterans so badly disabled they couldn't possibly have come in under the original deadline. It is this four-year extension that expired on July 25—and to which five more years have been added by the new law.

The law does one thing more, the VA said. It keeps open the doors of the vocational training program to disabled World War II veterans classed as exceptional cases. They now have the right to begin training, so long as they can complete it by the new 1965 deadline.

The exceptional cases are these:

1. World War II veterans whose disabilities prevented them from entering or completing training prior to the program's original deadlines;
2. Those who originally received discharges barring them from training, but whose discharges later were changed—but too late to get in under the original deadlines;
3. Those for whom a service-connected disability was not established in time to begin and complete a course of training.

The VA emphasized that the new law does not affect a separate training program for disabled Korea veterans. This program has its own deadlines—still a good way off in the future.

Question of the week:
Q—My GI insurance dividends are being held by VA as a credit under the Credit Option setup. If I fail to pay my quarterly premium due next month, will VA deduct it from my dividend credit?

Job Picture Status Quo Till Winter

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The government reports that 28 per cent of the nation's major industrial centers now have "substantial" unemployment and the job picture possibly will not improve before winter.

The Labor Department Friday night added five major production centers to the "d-pressed areas" list, which now totals 42 of the 150 major areas surveyed. This compared to 37 in July, 35 a year ago and 89 in the 1958 recession.

The department also said little improvement, if any, was expected in the job situation until "late autumn." It added that some of the 150 areas could look for job gains over the next few months, but that these increases probably would be offset by cutbacks elsewhere.

On the bright side, the department said in another report that the number of workers drawing unemployment benefits dropped by 20,000 to 1,571,000 in the week ending Sept. 24. This still was above the 1,158,000 total a year earlier.

Job improvements were expected mainly in non-manufacturing activities, with largest gains in pre-Christmas trade. The manufacturing job outlook depends largely on the critical steel and auto industries, where 1961 production will step up hiring in the coming weeks.

The new cities suffering "substantial" unemployment, where 6 per cent or more of the labor force is out of work, included: Birmingham, Ala.; San Diego, Calif.; Jersey City, N. J.; Canton, Ohio, and Muskegon-Muskegon Heights, Mich., which also was listed as now having "chronic" unemployment problems.

The "chronic" list now totals 22 major industrial center and 74 smaller points.

Milwaukee and Kenosha, Wis., and Columbus, Ohio, were shifted into the category of "moderate" unemployment of 3 to 6 per cent. Previously they were listed as having "low" unemployment.
