Tech's Maupin Slips To Third; Olivas Annexes Passing Lead

PORTLAND—Bob Pennel, Oregon College of Education sophomore halfback, took over the rushing lead of the Oregon Collegiate Conference this week by a yard. He replaces last week's leader, Bud Maupin of Oregon Tech.

Pennel has gained 263 yards in three games while Al (The Horse) Barnes of SOC moved into second place with 262 yards in four games for a 6.0 yard per carry average. Maupin is third with 242 yards.

Dick Olivas of Oregon Tech jumped ahead of SOC's John Buck in the passing department. Olivas and Bob Grant of PSC are tied with 22 completions but Olivas has tossed three fewer passes and gained 68 more yards. Olivas has tossed for 369 yards.

"Back of the Week" honors went to SOC's Doyle Branson, 18-year-old Jacksonville sopho-

more halfback, by a vote of conference coaches. Branson averaged four yards per carry against Portland State and scored two touchdowns while turning in a top defensive job for the Raiders.

"Lineman of the Week" honors went to another sophomore, Don Anderson, of Oregon Tech. The Tech center turned in an outstanding blocking game against EOC at La Grande.

Honorable mention went to backs Benny Houck, EOC; Roy Johnson, OTI; Bob Pennel, OCE, and Bob Grant, PSC. Linemen receiving votes were Bob Salter, EOC; Tom Morris and Howard Hartman, both of SOC; Herb Hermann, OCE, and Mickey Gray, PSC.

Two conference games are on Saturday's schedule. Southern Oregon travels to Oregon Tech for a homecoming game at 8 p.m.

UW, Bruin Tiff Feature On Saturday

Washington and UCLA, a pair of Rose Bowl hopefuls, clash in Seattle on Saturday in the most important college grid game of the West.

A crowd of about 45,000 is expected to see the battle that may go a long way toward determining the Big Five champion. The Huskies go into battle with a 28-10 victory over Stanford in their opening conference game.

But UCLA, idle the last two weeks, hasn't played in loop competition yet. The Bruins have a win over Pittsburgh and a tie with Purdue.

The feature performers should be quarterback Bob Schloredt of Washington and tailback Bill Kilmer of the Bruins. They run one-two in the league in total offense. Kilmer has picked up 429 yards—65 from rushing and 364 from passing. Schloredt, a bit more diversified, has gained 140 rushing, 288 passing. He has tossed for three touchdowns against one for Kilmer, however.

Meanwhile, California and Southern California clash in the Southland mainly in an attempt to salvage something from a disappointing season. The Trojans are heavy favorites. They have a 1-3 record, against 0-3-1 for the Golden Bears.

The big game among Northwest independents sends Washington State against Oregon and this should be a high-scoring dandy. The Cougars were involved in a 21-21 tie with Cal last week, while the Webfoots plastered San Jose State, 33-0.

Pel Jayvee Mentor Sees 'Comeback'

"The contact in practice competition has been better than in the course of games so far," coach Wade Patterson cited approvingly Wednesday, as his Klamath Union Jayvees underwent stiff practice sessions in preparation for the Medford tilt Saturday afternoon at 1:30 on Modoc Field.

The future Pelicans have the chance to redeem themselves Saturday after dropping their first loss of the season to Grants Pass last week.

Working hard in the backfield are fullbacks, Ron Hitchcock and Bud Thompson, and halfbacks, Bill Bianchi and Bud Wolter, in hopes of correcting last week's mistakes along with linemen Don Christy, Thurston Henzel and Bruce Campbell.

According to Patterson, there have been some changes due to injuries and a display of extra desire on the part of some of the former reserves, and more will come before Saturday.

He said, "Although Medford's Jayvees probably would have to be rated No. 1, we don't intend to play dead. We have the type of boys who will come back to make it a real ball game, after our defeat in Grants Pass last week."

Oregon Trio Starts Cage Practices

Basketball practice will open at Oregon's three major collegiate hoop powers Saturday.

Oregon State, Oregon and the University of Portland all will have most of last year's teams back.

Oregon State could start a team on which the shortest man would be 6-6, Coach Slat Gill, apparently recovered from a heart attack that idled him in mid-season last year, probably won't do that, though.

He is expected to put more speed into the lineup with Bill Wold at 6 feet, and Jim Woodland at 6-1. Others back from the starting five last year are Karl Anderson at 6-10, Steve Flynn at 6-5 and Jay Carty at 6-7. Five of six other lettermen stand 6-6.

Oregon will have veterans Glen Moore at 6-7, Wally Knecht at 6-6, Charley Warren, Bill Simmons and Denny Strickland at 6-4 and Butch Kimpton at 6-1. Coach Steve Beiko said he is considering putting Knecht at center to get Moore loose for more free-lancing.

KU Freshmen Slate Battle With Ashland

Coach DeLancey Duncan's KU freshmen have the job of proving themselves to their coach Saturday afternoon at 1:30 when they tangle with the Ashland Grizzlies.

The frosh, who displayed little fight and spark last week in Medford, have been scrimmaging among themselves this past week, and as a result there are some changes in the starting lineup and maybe more due before Saturday, says Duncan.

Receiving the starting nod for the encounter are Tom Day and Ray Taylor or Bob Rodgers, ends; Bill Mills and Steve Campbell, tackles; Jim Walker and Mike McKibben, guards, and center Dean Guyer.

The backfield is still undecided. Chuck Mills will start at left half, while Rich Bath will take up his regular post at right half. Coach Duncan will go with either Lannie Guver, John Parisot or Walt Smith at quarterback. Duncan says that off their performances in practice, the young Pelicans look as if they could come back to take tomorrow's game. "But if they played like they did last week, we won't be in this one either," he cautioned.

Commission Pays Tribute

After 37 years of continuous affiliation with the Fish Commission of Oregon, Michael (Mike) T. Hoy, as administrative head for 20 years, was honored at a dinner of commissioners, staff members, and associates upon his retirement Friday night at the Hotel Congress, Portland.

In 1923, when Hoy was named auditor, there were only three other members of the administrative staff occupying 700 square feet of office space in the old Gas Company building in downtown Portland. Since that time the staff, including fish culture, research, administration, and engineering, has grown to 180 persons; the commission operates 16 hatcheries and eight research laboratories, and conducts numerous conservation and testing activities statewide.



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
