#### ORANGE POTATO REFRIGERATOR ROLLS

Temperature 400 degrees.  
Time 20 to 25 minutes.  
Mix together  $1\frac{1}{2}$  c. lukewarm water or potato water; 2-3 cup sugar,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. salt, add 1 cake yeast. Mix together. Add mix. 2 eggs, 2-3 cup shortening.  
Mix first with spoon then with hand, 1 cup lukewarm mashed potatoes, 7 (about) cups flour.  
Put in refrigerator. Two hours before baking, shape dough into desired rolls or coffee cake. Cover and let rise until light. Frosted orange rolls: Roll out dough as for cinnamon rolls. Add  $\frac{1}{2}$  creamy orange filling to dough. Roll and cut. Put in greased pan. Let rise to almost double. Bake. Remove from pan and frost with remaining orange frosting.

Orange filling and frosting: Beat until smooth: 3 tsp. soft butter, dash of salt, 3 tsp. concentrated orange juice,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  c. powdered sugar.

#### POTATO CAKE FROSTING

1 lb. package powdered sugar  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  cup mashed potatoes  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  cup orange juice  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  tsp. salt  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. vanilla  
3 tbsp. melted butter  
Put all ingredients in a bowl and beat until light and fluffy—will ice a large cake.
