

Legislative Interim Education Group Urges Increased School District Aid

EUGENE (AP) — The Legislative Interim Committee on Education Saturday urged the state to increase the percentage of aid it provides Oregon school districts and also waged a battle over Oregon & California land money.

The committee suggested that over a five year period the state's share of current expenditure of each school district be boosted to 50 per cent.

This recommendation, the committee said, should be referred to the voters for final approval.

It also recommended that 12 1/2 per cent of fees of counties receiving O&C money be included in the basic figures on which state aid to counties is based. This would lessen the state aid contribution to those 18 counties with O&C lands.

This drew opposition from state legislators of O&C counties.

A minority report opposing the O&C proposal was submitted by Reps. Nancy Kirkpatrick of Lebanon, Evelyn Nye of Medford, Tom Monaghan of Milwaukie and Al Flegel of Roseburg. All are Democrats except Mrs. Nye, a Republican. Their action insured a fight in the Legislature over the proposal.

The committee recommended that state aid be distributed to guarantee every district the same amount of money per weighted average daily membership. This is a formula worked out on the basis of average attendance.

Every district, it added, should receive a minimum amount of state aid with special provisions made for those districts that make an exceptional effort to provide an educational program.

Another major recommendation urged that the state Board of Education be increased from seven to nine members. Terms of members also would be limited to seven consecutive years.

The committee, under Chairman Ward Cook, D-Portland, also suggested the office of state superintendent of public instruction be appointed instead of elective.

Mikoyan Dropped From Soviet Activities, Reports Claim

LONDON (UPI) — Soviet First Deputy Premier Anastas Ivanovich Mikoyan is in eclipse, according to diplomatic dispatches reaching London today.

The reports said the "Armenian wizard" of the Kremlin has faded out of the Soviet hierarchy's major activities lately.

There are growing indications Mikoyan may be on his way out of power altogether, the dispatches said.

One indication Mikoyan appears to be slipping came in the latest issue of the Soviet bimonthly history of the Soviet Communist Party.

The publication describes the history of the Armenian Communist Party without once mentioning Mikoyan's name.

Previous Soviet histories of the Armenian party gave top billing to Mikoyan. They used to call him one of the party's first heroes.

Mikoyan was not among the delegation of Kremlin leaders who welcomed Premier Nikita Khrushchev in Moscow on his return from New York. Soviet Presidium member Demitri Polyansky told newsmen Mikoyan was on vacation.

Mikoyan also was absent from among Soviet leaders who clustered at Moscow's airport when Khrushchev flew home from a Far East trip last April.

Omission of leading Soviet figures from official party publications in the past has heralded their eclipse or downfall.

The reasons and circumstances for Mikoyan's apparent fall remained shrouded in mystery thus far.

A strong advocate of the peaceful coexistence policy, he was known to have encountered Red China's wrath of late. Road Bill Asked

SALEM (AP) — The Legislative Interim Committee on Highways has called for legislation to provide \$4 million for reconstruction of Highway 42 from Coos Bay to Roseburg.

The committee said the 1959 Legislature gave authority to the state Highway Commission to issue and sell \$4 million of general purpose highway bonds for the project.

The committee's report prepared for the next Legislature said the project had been delayed because of bonding attorneys' interpretation of the bill. The attorneys said wording of the bill meant that bonds intended for reconstruction of the highway could be sold only if federal funds matched the state's, the report said.

The occasion will be the annual meeting of the Woodrow Wilson Birthplace Foundation.

Announcing this today, the White House said Eisenhower will visit the home where Wilson was born and speak at Mary Baldwin College where Wilson made an address as president-elect in 1912.

Eisenhower plans to fly to Staunton.

From the airport, he will go to Mount Sidney, Va., where his mother, Ida Stover Eisenhower, was born. He plans to visit her girlhood home.

Then the President will go on to visit the Wilson birthplace at Staunton before his speech at Mary Baldwin College.
