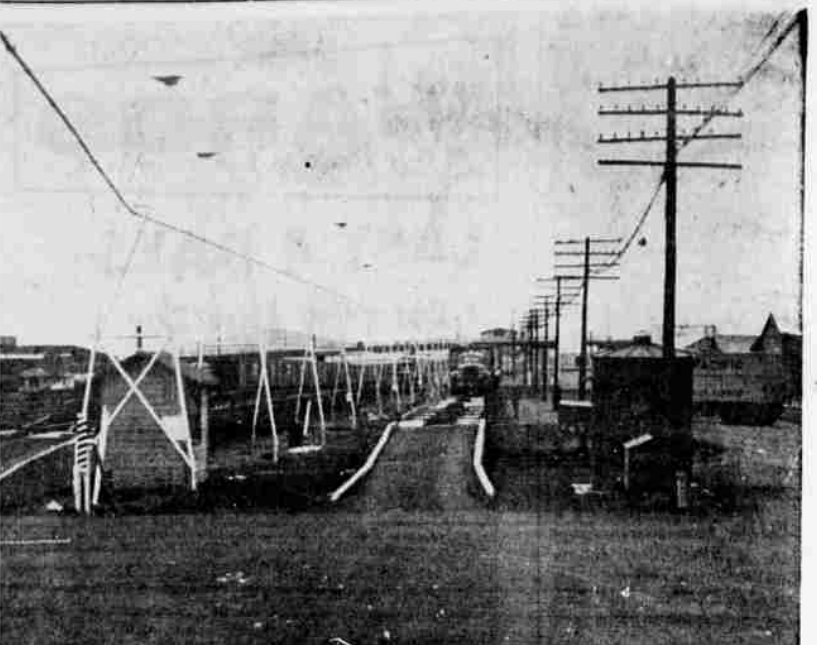

Car Mishap Piano Duo To Perform

A circuit court jury was told this morning that Joseph Vernon Meyrick, on trial for manslaughter in the auto accident death of a Kingsley Field airman last month, "smelled strongly of alcohol" when he was arrested at the accident scene.

Deputy District Attorney Max McMillin added that a laboratory test revealed .155 grams of alcohol in 100 cubic centimeters of Meyrick's blood.

McMillin made the remarks in his opening statement, before testimony began in the trial. The state maintains Meyrick struck Sgt. Ivan Hetrick, 42, Kingsley Field airman, while Hetrick was crossing South Sixth Street at East Main shortly after midnight September 11.

Hertrick died in Klamath Valley Hospital a few hours later of a skull injury, McMillin said. Defense attorneys Richard C. Beesley and P. K. Puckett successfully moved before Judge David R. Vandenberg that they reserve an opening statement until the state has rested its case.

City Police Officer Darrell Hilliker was the first witness called by the state.

The jury viewed the accident scene this morning before court proceedings resumed. Members of the jury are Frank Obenchain Jr. of Rly, Nan J. Brady of Malin, and John W. Inley, Alta F. Thompson, Rudolph Meyers, Albert W. Lynch, Bertha Thurman, Paul N. Barnes, John W. Van Doren, Virginia A. Knowles, Violet C. Phillips, and Leona O. Maxwell, all of Klamath Falls.
